HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3032

1 A concurrent resolution urging the President of the United States and Congress to fund fully all 2 federal programs and to evaluate carefully the impact of any proposed budget cuts on the men, 3 women, and children of this state who rely and depend on the federal programs for their health, 4 their safety, their education, and their economic well-being. 5 WHEREAS. Medicaid is a program jointly funded by the federal and state governments 6 for the purpose of assisting states in providing medical and health-related services to people 7 with limited income; and 8 WHEREAS, the community development block grant program helps to ensure decent 9 affordable housing for all, provides services to the most vulnerable in our communities, creates 10 jobs, and expands business opportunities; and 11 **WHEREAS**, the National Science Foundation promotes the progress of science, 12 advances the national health, prosperity, and welfare and secures the national defense; and 13 WHEREAS, the rural housing and economic development program provides capacity 14 building at the state and local level and supports innovative housing and economic 15 development activities in rural areas; and 16 WHEREAS, the Brownfields economic development initiative stimulates and promotes 17 economic and community development and assists cities with the redevelopment of 18 abandoned, idled, and underused industrial and commercial facilities; and 19 WHEREAS, empowerment zones create opportunities for entrepreneurial initiatives, 20 small business expansion, and training for jobs that offer upward mobility; and 21 WHEREAS, the initiative for renewal communities provides incentives for new 22 businesses, provides thousands of new jobs, rehabilitates old housing, builds new housing, and 23 changes lives in urban and rural areas; and 24 WHEREAS, Pell grants assist undergraduate students based on financial need and

serve as the foundation upon which students can build their sources of education aid; and

WHEREAS, veterans' services provide health benefits, education benefits, burial
services, employment services, life insurance, pensions, and home loan guarantees to veterans
in this state and across this nation; and

WHEREAS, the Edward Byrne memorial state and local law enforcement assistance grant program is a partnership among federal, state, and local governments to create safer communities through the support of multijurisdictional drug task forces, drug courts, drug education and prevention programs, and other efforts to reduce drug abuse and prosecute drug offenders; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture programs facilitate the marketing of agricultural products; promote research; provide agricultural information; protect and promote agricultural health; stabilize the income of farmers and ranchers through conservation, credit, and disaster assistance efforts; and help farmers manage their agricultural risks; and

WHEREAS, each of these programs deeply and significantly affects citizens of this state, individually and collectively; and

WHEREAS, any reduction in the funding of these programs would create deep and significant economic hardships to the men, women, and children of this state who have come to rely and depend on these programs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly urges the President of the United States and Congress to fund fully all federal programs and to evaluate carefully the impact of any proposed budget cuts on the men, women, and children of this state who rely and depend on the federal programs for their health, their safety, their education, and their economic well-being; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution to the President of the United States, the director of the United States Office of Management and Budget, the majority and minority leaders of the United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate, and to each member of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation.
