1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the need for supportive

2 housing and services, including emergency shelters, transition housing, and permanent

3 supportive housing for homeless individuals and families with children.

WHEREAS, a survey of key leaders representing cities, counties, reservations, public
housing authorities, banks, realtors, apartment associations, builders, and statewide housing
organizations found that three out of four key leaders expressed the need for the state to play a
role in increasing the supply of adequate and affordable housing; and

8 **WHEREAS**, the quality of life for homeless individuals and families with children in this

9 state is threatened by a lack of affordable and supportive housing and services; and

WHEREAS, in November 2004 the North Dakota State University Data Center issued a
statewide housing needs assessment that recommended special attention be given to housing
for special needs populations, including the homeless; and

WHEREAS, there is an unmet housing need in this state for approximately 2,000 beds
for homeless individuals and families with children; and

WHEREAS, the benefit of supportive housing for homeless individuals and families with children would be increased quality of life, increased length of employment, reduced time spent in emergency rooms, jails, and detoxification units, and reduced costs to the county and the state;

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

20 OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Legislative Council study the need for supportive housing and services, including emergency shelters, transition housing, and permanent supportive housing for homeless individuals and families with children; and Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly
