## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1076

(At the request of the Education Standards and Practices Board)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-06-06, 15.1-13-13, 15.1-18-07,
- 2 15.1-18-10, and 15.1-18.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to licensing,
- 3 qualifications, and national certification of teachers.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
  - **15.1-06-06. Approval of public and nonpublic schools.** Each public and nonpublic school in this state offering elementary or secondary education to students must be approved by the superintendent of public instruction. Except as otherwise provided by law, the superintendent may not approve a school unless:
    - Each classroom teacher holds a valid teaching eertificate license issued by the
      education standards and practices board or is approved to teach by the education
      standards and practices board;
    - 2. The students are offered all subjects required by law; and
    - 3. The school is in compliance with all local and state health, fire, and safety laws.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15.1-13-13. Provisional teaching license Period of effectiveness Renewal. The
  board may issue a provisional teaching license to an applicant awaiting completion of the
  background check required by section 15.1-13-14 or awaiting documentation of the original
  application. The provisional license is valid for a period of forty days and may be renewed with
  the approval of the board. The board may adopt rules governing the issuance of a provisional

2	teaching license may not be charged a fee.

17	3.	In order to teach any grade from one through grade eight in a self-contained				
18		classroom an elementary school, an individual must be licensed to teach by the				
19		education standards and practices board and:				
20		a. Have a major in elementary education; or				
21		b. Have a major equivalency in elementary education.				
22	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-18-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is

30		reim	nburse the state an amount equal to one-half of the amount awarded to the
31		indi	vidual as a scholarship.

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1	<u>6.</u>	<u>At t</u>	he conclusion of each of the first four school years after the individual receives
2		nati	onal board certification, the individual is entitled to receive an additional one
3		thou	usand five hundred dollars if:
4		<u>a.</u>	The individual served during the school year as a full-time classroom teacher
5			in a public or nonpublic school; and
6		<u>b.</u>	The individual participated in any efforts of the employing school district to
7			develop and implement teacher mentoring programs.
8	<u>7.</u>	Col	lect and review in the order received scholarship applications for national board
9		rece	ertification from individuals who are licensed to teach by the board or approved
10		to to	each by the board. The board shall:
11		<u>a.</u>	Approve no more than two applications per year;
12		<u>b.</u>	Require the recipient to serve during the school year as a full-time classroom
13			teacher in a public or nonpublic school in this state; and
14		<u>C.</u>	Require the recipient to participate in mentoring programs developed and
15			implemented in the employing school or school district.
