- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-30-01, 43-30-02, and 43-30-03 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to licensing persons engaged in private investigative service or
- 3 private security service.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-30-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 43-30-01. Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context or subject matter
   otherwise requires:
- 9 1. "Board" means the private investigative and security board.
- 2. "Employee" means to be in an employer-employee relationship in which the
  employee is providing work in exchange for compensation and the employer
  directly controls the employee's conduct and pays some taxes on behalf of the
  employee. The term "employed" may not be construed to include independent
  contractors.
- 15 <u>3.</u> "License" includes a registration issued by the board.
- 16 3. 4. "Licensee" includes an individual who is registered by the board.
- 4. <u>5.</u> "Private investigative service" means <del>obtaining or furnishing information with</del>
   reference to any act or individual, for a fee, reward, or other consideration,
   undertaking any of the following acts for the purpose of obtaining information for others:
- a. <u>Investigating the identity, habits, conduct, movements, whereabouts,</u>
   transactions, reputation, or character of any person or organization;
- b. <u>Investigating the credibility of persons</u>;

1		<u>C.</u>	Investigating the location or recovery of lost or stolen property, missing
2			persons, owners of abandoned property or escheated property, or heirs to
3			estates;
4		<u>d.</u>	Investigating the origin of and responsibility for libels, losses, accidents, or
5			damage or injuries to persons or property;
6		<u>e.</u>	Investigating the affiliation, connection, or relationship of any person, firm, or
7			corporation with any organization, society, or association, or with any official,
8			representative, or member thereof;
9		<u>f.</u>	Investigating the conduct, honesty, efficiency, loyalty, or activities of
10			employees, persons seeking employment, agents, or contractors and
11			subcontractors;
12		<u>g.</u>	Investigating or obtaining evidence to be used before any authorized
13			investigating committee, board of award, board of arbitration, administrative
14			body, or officer or in preparation for trial of civil or criminal cases; or
15		<u>h.</u>	Investigating the identity or apprehension of persons suspected of crimes or
16			wrongdoing.
17	<del>5.</del> <u>6.</u>	"Pri	vate security service" means furnishing for hire security officers or other
18		per	sons to <del>protect</del> :
19		<u>a.</u>	Protect persons or property, or to prevent the:
20		<u>b.</u>	Prevent or detect theft or the unlawful taking of goods, wares, and or
21			merchandise, or to prevent the misappropriation or concealment of goods,
22			wares, merchandise, money, bonds, stocks, choses in action, notes, or other
23			valuable documents or papers, or the business of performing the service of
24			such security officer or other person for any of these purposes;
25		<u>C.</u>	Control, regulate, or direct the flow of or movements of the public, whether by
26			vehicle or otherwise, to assure protection of private property;
27		<u>d.</u>	Prevent or detect intrusion, unauthorized entry or activity, vandalism, or
28			trespass on private property;
29		<u>e.</u>	Perform the service of a security officer or other person for any of these
30			purposes; or

1		f. Transport money or negotiable securities to or from a financial institution or
2		between business locations on a regular or daily basis, except for mail
3		delivery.
4	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-30-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
6	43-3	30-02. Exemptions. This chapter does not apply to:
7	1.	Any investigator or officer directly employed by or under any direct contract with
8		the federal government, state, or any county or city thereof, appointed, elected, or
9		contracted with, by due authority of law, while engaged in the performance of
10		official duties. Subcontractors of agencies directly contracted with these entities
11		are not exempted.
12	2.	Any state's attorney.
13	3.	Any attorneys or counselors at law in the regular practice of their profession and
14		any paralegal or legal assistant employed by an attorney or law firm when the
15		attorney or law firm retains complete responsibility for the work product of the
16		paralegal or legal assistant.
17	4.	Any person whose sole investigative business is the furnishing of information as to
18		the business and financial standing and credit of persons engaged exclusively in
19		obtaining and furnishing information as to the financial standing, rating, and credit
20		responsibility of persons or as to the personal habits and financial responsibilities
21		of applicants for insurance, indemnity bonds, or commercial credit.
22	<u>5.</u>	A collection agency or finance company licensed to do business under the laws of
23		this state, or an employee of one of those companies, while acting within the scope
24		of employment when making an investigation incidental to the business of the
25		agency, including an investigation as to location of a debtor and of the debtor's
26		assets or property, provided the client has a financial interest in or a lien upon the
27		assets or property of the debtor.
28	<del>5.</del> <u>6.</u>	Any person making any investigation of any matter in which that person or the
29		person by whom that person is solely employed is interested or involved.
30	<del>6.</del>	Any person making any investigation for any person engaged in the business of
31		transporting persons or property in interstate commerce.

- 1 7. Any adjuster or investigator representing an insurance company.
  - 8. 7. A person whose sole investigative business is obtaining or furnishing information about acts or individuals from public records, other than those investigating the location or recovery of abandoned or escheated property, owners of abandoned or escheated property, or heirs to estates.
    - 8. An expert who specializes in a specific, limited area of practice, including automotive accident reconstructions, fire cause and origin inspections, technical surveillance counter measures, handwriting analysis, auditor, accountant or accounting clerk performing audits or accounting functions, or other areas of practice covered by other licensure in the state, and other areas determined by the board, that fall within the individual's scope of employment, incidental to the investigative profession.
    - 9. Persons reporting for any media, including news reporters or news investigators.
  - **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-30-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - 43-30-03. Private investigative and security board. The governor shall appoint a private investigative and security board. The board must consist of not less than five nor more than eleven members appointed for staggered four-year terms. Appointees to the board must be knowledgeable in private investigative or private security matters. A majority of the members of the board must be actively engaged in the private investigative or security profession, with at least one member actively engaged in law enforcement. Members of the board may not receive any compensation for their service on the board, but they are entitled to be reimbursed for their expenses incurred in performing their duties in the amounts provided by law for state employees.
