- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 10-15-01.1, a new subsection to section 10-15-36,
- a new subsection to section 10-15-54, and section 10-15-62 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to legal recognition of electronic records and electronic signatures, exempting some
- 4 information from open records laws, and fees for filing documents with the secretary of state;
- 5 and to amend and reenact section 10-15-01 and subsection 1 of section 10-15-29 of the North
- 6 Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions and officers of cooperative associations.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 10-15-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 **10-15-01. Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise,
- 1. "Association" includes both cooperatives and foreign cooperatives.
- 13 2. "Cooperative" means an association incorporated under this chapter.
- 14 3. "Corporation" means all corporations not associations.
- 4. "Electronic" means relating to technology having electrical, digital, magnetic,
  wireless, optical, electromagnetic, or similar capabilities.
- a. Creates a record that may be retained, retrieved, and reviewed by a recipient
  of the communication; and
- b. May be directly reproduced in paper form by the recipient through an
  automated process.
- 23 <u>"Electronic record" means a record created, generated, sent, communicated,</u>
  24 received, or stored by electronic means.

ı	<u>/.</u>	Electronic signature means an electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to	
2		or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the	
3		intent to sign the record.	
4	<u>8.</u>	"Filed with the secretary of state" means, except as otherwise permitted by law or	
5		<u>rule:</u>	
6		a. That a document meeting the applicable requirements of this chapter together	
7		with the fees provided in section 10-15-54 was delivered or communicated to	
8		the secretary of state by a method or medium of communication acceptable	
9		by the secretary of state and was determined by the secretary of state to	
10		conform to law.	
11		b. That the secretary of state shall then:	
12		(1) Record the actual date on which the document is filed, and if different,	
13		the effective date of filing; and	
14		(2) Record the document in the office of the secretary of state.	
15	<u>9.</u>	"Foreign cooperative" means an association incorporated under a cooperative law	
16		of another state which has members residing within this state and which is	
17		operating on the following cooperative bases:	
18		a. Either no member of the foreign cooperative who is an individual is allowed	
19		more than one vote because of the amount of stock or membership capital th	
20		member owns therein, or the foreign cooperative does not pay dividends on	
21		stock or membership capital in excess of eight percent per annum.	
22		b. The foreign cooperative shall not deal in the products of or for nonmembers to	
23		an amount greater in value than such as are handled by it for members.	
24		c. The foreign cooperative distributes its proceeds according to either the law	
25		governing cooperatives of this state or the law of the state of its incorporation	
26	<del>5.</del> <u>10.</u>	"Member" means a person who has been qualified and accepted for membership	
27		in an association.	
28	SEC	CTION 2. Section 10-15-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and	
29	enacted as	follows:	
30	<u>10-</u>	15-01.1. Legal recognition of electronic records and electronic signatures. For	
31	purposes of this chapter:		

1	<u>1.</u>	A record or signature may not be denied legal effect or enforceability solely
2		because it is in electronic form;
3	<u>2.</u>	A contract may not be denied legal effect or enforceability solely because an
4		electronic record was used in its formation;
5	<u>3.</u>	If a provision requires a record to be in writing, then an electronic record satisfies
6		the requirement; and
7	<u>4.</u>	If a provision requires a signature, then an electronic signature satisfies the
8		requirement.
9	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 10-15-29 of the North Dakota
10	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
11	1.	The principal officers of a cooperative are a president, one or more vice presidents
12		and a treasurer as prescribed in the bylaws, and a secretary, and a treasurer.
13		They shall be elected annually by the board at such time and in such manner as
14		the bylaws provide. Each principal officer except the secretary and the treasurer
15		must be a director of the cooperative. The offices of secretary and treasurer may
16		be combined in one person. If the bylaws provide, the board of directors may also
17		elect from its number a chairman and one or more vice chairmen, in which case
18		the president and vice presidents need not be directors or stockholders.
19	SEC	CTION 4. A new subsection to section 10-15-36 of the North Dakota Century Code
20	is created and enacted as follows:	
21		Fees paid to the secretary of state according to subsections 4, 5, and 6 are not
22		refundable if an annual report submitted to the secretary of state cannot be filed
23		because it lacks information required by subsection 1 or lacks sufficient payment
24		as required by subsections 4, 5, and 6.
25	SEC	CTION 5. A new subsection to section 10-15-54 of the North Dakota Century Code
26	is created and enacted as follows:	
27		Any document submitted for approval before the actual time of submission for
28		filing, one-half of the fee provided in this section for filing the document.
29	SEC	CTION 6. Section 10-15-62 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
30	enacted as follows:	

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- 1 <u>10-15-62. Secretary of state Confidential records.</u> Any social security number or
- 2 <u>federal tax identification number disclosed or contained in any document filed with the secretary</u>
- 3 of state under this chapter is confidential. The secretary of state shall delete or obscure any
- 4 social security number or federal tax identification number before a copy of any document is
- 5 released to the public.
