- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 6-09 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the establishment of a livestock loan guarantee program; to amend
- and reenact section 4-14.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to agricultural
- 4 grants; to provide for a report; and to provide an expiration date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 4-14.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 4-14.1-03.1. Agricultural products utilization commission Authority.
- The North Dakota agricultural products utilization commission may apply for,
 accept, and expend any appropriation, grant, gift, or service made available from
 public or private sources consistent with the purpose of this chapter.
- 12 <u>2.</u> The commission may administer grant programs consistent with the purpose of this chapter including <u>a:</u>
 - <u>a.</u> A basic and applied research grant program;
 - <u>b.</u> <u>A</u> utilization and marketing grant program;
- 16 c. A cooperative marketing grant program;
- 17 <u>d. A nature-based tourism grant program;</u>
- 18 <u>e. A technical assistance grant program for value-added businesses;</u>
- 19 \underline{f} . \underline{A} farm diversification grant program;
- 20 g. An agricultural prototype development grant program; and a
- 21 <u>h.</u> <u>A</u> North American marketing grant program. The
- As a condition of the grant, the commission may require, by contract, repayment of
 a grant, in whole or in part, that the recipient repay some or all of the grant if the
 grant recipient does not fulfill the conditions under which the grant was awarded of

1		the grant. Repayment may be monetary or may be of any other type or method
2		determined by the commission to be in the public interest.
3	SEC	CTION 2. A new section to chapter 6-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	created and enacted as follows:	
5	Livestock loan guarantee program - Establishment - Rules.	
6	<u>1.</u>	The Bank of North Dakota shall establish and administer a livestock loan
7		guarantee program that is designed to expand livestock feeding in this state.
8	<u>2.</u>	Under the program, the Bank may guarantee a loan made by a bank, a credit
9		union, a savings and loan association, or any other lending institution in this state
10		to the owner of a commercial feedlot that backgrounds or feeds cattle to
11		harvest-ready weight. In the event of a default, the Bank shall pay to the lender
12		the amount agreed upon, provided that the amount may not exceed eighty-five
13		percent of the principal due the lender at the time the claim is approved.
14	<u>3.</u>	The Bank shall adopt rules governing additional terms, conditions, and procedures
15		necessary to meet the requirements of this section. The rules must include an
16		administrative fee payable to the Bank and must provide that equity requirements
17		may not exceed fifteen percent.
18	SECTION 3. REPORT TO COMMITTEES. Between the first and tenth legislative days	
19	of the regular session of the sixtieth legislative assembly as selected by the legislative council,	
20	the agriculture commissioner, the Bank of North Dakota, and the North Dakota stockmen's	
21	association shall provide a joint report regarding the livestock loan guarantee program to the	
22	standing agriculture committee of each house of the legislative assembly.	
23	SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. Section 2 of this Act is effective through June 30,	
24	2009, and after that date is ineffective.
