- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsections 1, 2, and 3 of section 53-06.2-11 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to bet payoff formulas.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsections 1, 2, and 3 of section 53-06.2-11 of the
 North Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 1. For each day of a live race meet or a simulcast day in this state on win, place, a. 7 and show parimutuel pools, the licensee shall deduct up to twenty percent of 8 the total win, place, and show pool. On the first eleven million dollars of total 9 wagering handle in each biennium, two percent must be paid to the state 10 treasurer to be deposited in the general fund. One-half of one percent must be 11 paid to the North Dakota racing commission to be used for the North Dakota 12 purse fund. One-half of one percent must be paid to the North Dakota racing 13 commission to be used for the North Dakota breeders' fund for the respective 14 breed of horses racing at that meet. On the first thirty five million five hundred 15 thousand dollars of total wagering handle in each biennium, two percent must 16 be paid to the state treasurer to be deposited in the general fund. On the total 17 wagering handle in excess of thirty five million five hundred thousand dollars in each biennium, one-half of one percent must be paid to the state treasurer 18 19 to be deposited in the general fund. 20 On the wagering handle on win, place, and show wagering pools in excess of b. 21 eleven million dollars in each biennium, one-sixteenth of one percent must be
- paid to the commission to be deposited in the purse fund; one-sixteenth of
 one percent must be paid to the commission to be deposited in the promotion
 fund; one-sixteenth of one percent must be paid to the commission to be

1		deposited in the breeders' fund; and one-sixteenth of one percent must be
2		paid to the state treasurer to be deposited in the general fund.
3	2.	For each day of a live race meet or a simulcast day in this state for each daily
4		double, quinella, exacta, trifecta, or other wager combining two or more horses for
5		winning payoffs, the licensee shall deduct up to twenty-five percent of each
6		wagering pool. Of each wagering dollar, the amounts to be deposited in the
7		general fund and other funds are as follows:
8		a. On the first one hundred two eleven million four hundred thousand dollars of
9		wagering handle in each biennium, one-half of one percent must be paid to
10		the commission to be deposited in the purse fund; one-half of one percent
11		must be paid to the commission to be deposited in the promotion fund;
12		one-half of one percent must be paid to the commission to be deposited in the
13		breeders' fund; and two and one-half percent must be paid to the state
14		treasurer to be deposited in the general fund.
15		b. On the wagering handle in excess of one hundred two eleven million four
16		hundred thousand dollars in each biennium, one-half one-sixteenth of one
17		percent must be paid to the commission to be deposited in the purse fund;
18		one-half one-sixteenth of one percent must be paid to the commission to be
19		deposited in the promotion fund; one-half <u>one-sixteenth</u> of one percent must
20		be paid to the commission to be deposited in the breeders' fund; and
21		one-fourth one sixteenth of one percent must be paid to the state treasurer to
22		be deposited in the general fund.
23	3.	Unclaimed tickets and breakage from each live race meet and simulcast program
24		as defined by the commission and the percentage of the wagering pool to be paid
25		to the racing promotion fund under subsections 1 and 2 must be retained by the
26		commission in a special fund to assist in improving and upgrading racetracks in the
27		state, for the promotion of horse racing within the state, and in developing new
28		racetracks in the state as necessary and approved by the commission.
29		Notwithstanding this section, the commission may, upon approval of the attorney
30		general, receive no more than twenty-five percent of this fund for the purpose of
31		payment of operating expenses of the commission. In lieu of breakage, one-fourth

1of one percent of the first eleven million dollars wagered in the biennium from each2live race meet and simulcast program as defined by the commission must be paid3to the commission and retained by the commission. All breakage must go to the4provider.
