- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-09-31 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the publication of school board proceedings.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-09-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

- Every two years, at the time of a school district's annual election of board
 members, the electors of the district shall determine whether a record of the board
 proceedings must be published in the official newspaper of the district. If a majority
 of the electors voting on the question approve the publication, the school district
 business manager shall provide for publication of the school board proceedings,
 including an itemized list of obligations approved for payment.
- 13 <u>2.</u> <u>The business manager shall:</u>
- 14a.Include in the publication of school board proceedings an itemized list of15obligations approved for payment; or
- 16b. (1)Post the itemized list of obligations approved for payment on the17internet for a period of at least twelve months; and
- 18(2)Include in the publication of school board proceedings the web site at19which the list may be viewed and indicate that the itemized list is also20available in printed form upon request.
- 3. If appropriate, the business manager shall require that the newspaper publishing
 the board proceedings indicate that the published proceedings are subject to
 review and revision by the board.

- <u>4.</u> The business manager shall ensure that the proceedings are published within a
 reasonable time after each board meeting.
- 3 <u>5.</u> A vote to approve the publication is effective for a period of two years or until
 disapproved at a succeeding school district election.
