The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Dalrymple presiding.

The prayer was offered by Chaplain Burnie Kunz, MedCenter One, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present.

A quorum was declared by the President.

MOTION

SEN. THANE MOVED that the remarks of Senator Stenehjem be printed in the Journal, which motion prevailed.

REMARKS OF MAJORITY LEADER STENEHJEM

Mr. President, I have some sad news to report today. Former Senator Evan Lips passed away last night at the age of 86. Evan Lips was from District 47 in Bismarck and served the Senate for 38 years from 1961 through 1997. He served as Majority Leader in 1967 and President Pro Tem in 1971.

In his first session, Evan served on the Finance and Taxation and Judiciary Committees, but for the remaining 36 years of his service, he served on the Appropriations Committee, chairing that committee from 1973 through 1985.

Prior to his service in the Senate, Evan proudly served his country in World War II as a decorated Marine in the South Pacific. He was also elected Mayor of Bismarck in 1954 and held that office for 12 years.

Those of us who knew him appreciated his legendary ability to remember facts and figures from sessions long past and his willingness to work across party lines. He was tireless in his commitment to countless civic organizations. Even those who never had a chance to meet him will benefit from his big heart and major accomplishments due to all that he achieved for higher education. In recognition of his efforts, the University of North Dakota Medical School and Health Sciences in 2003 named an auditorium in his honor.

In his own words, Senator Lips said, "I'd like to think that a city or a state can use people in the political arena, that people should offer their talents to the community and try to make it a better place." Senator Evan Lips certainly made the Senate and the State of North Dakota a better place. Our hearts and prayers are with his family today. He will truly be missed.

His funeral service is scheduled for Friday at 10:30 a.m., at Trinity Lutheran Church.

SB 2175: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 6-03-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to real estate appraisal requirements for real estate loans by banks.

SB 2176: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 31 of section 57-39.2-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to sales and use tax exemption for sales of precious metal bullion; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

Sens. Wardner, Taylor and Reps. Kreidt, Onstad introduced:

SB 2177: A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 57-39.2-04.5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a sales and use tax exemption for dairy farm machinery, equipment, and structural materials; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

Sens. Wardner, Taylor and Reps. Kreidt, Onstad introduced:

SB 2178: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-38 and a new subsection to section 57-38-30.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an individual and corporate income tax credit for certain investments in a dairy farm milking operation; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Christmann's motion.
