- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to the creation of a business and tourism acceleration commission; and to
- 3 amend and reenact section 54-34.3-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to patents
- 4 held by the business and tourism acceleration commission.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-34.3-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

54-34.3-08. Patents. The division of economic development and finance, the North
Dakota development fund, incorporated, the business and tourism acceleration commission,
and the North Dakota agricultural products utilization commission may hold or assign for
remuneration all or a portion of their interest in patents or royalty rights acquired in the course of
their operation and performance of duties as provided by law.
SECTION 2. A new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
enacted as follows:

15 **Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

16 <u>1.</u> <u>"Commission" means the business and tourism acceleration commission.</u>

17 <u>2.</u> <u>"Department" means the department of commerce.</u>

18 **Policy of state - Responsibility of commission.** It is the public policy of this state to

19 protect and foster the prosperity and general welfare of its people by improving the business

20 economy of the state. In furtherance of this policy, the commission shall provide necessary

21 assistance for the research, development, technology, and marketing needs of businesses and

22 <u>entrepreneurs in the state to aid in innovation for new or existing businesses, expansion of</u>

23 existing and development of new tourism-based businesses, and growth of international

24 <u>business through trade.</u>

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1	Bu	siness and tourism acceleration commission - Composition - Appointment.
2	<u>1.</u>	The business and tourism acceleration commission consists of seven members as
3		follows:
4		a. Three members appointed by the governor, for terms of two years, arranged
5		so that one term expires in odd-numbered years and two terms expire in
6		even-numbered years. One of these members must be from the private
7		sector and actively engaged in businesses in this state, one must be from the
8		private sector and actively engaged in a business in this state which
9		participates in international trade, and one must be from the private sector
10		and actively engaged in the tourism industry in this state.
11		b. Four members appointed by the commissioner of commerce, for terms of two
12		years, arranged so that two terms expire in odd-numbered years and two
13		terms expire in even-numbered years. One of these members must represent
14		business interests, one must represent international trade interests, one must
15		represent tourism interests, and one must represent innovation interests. The
16		commissioner may fill any of these positions with ex officio members.
17	<u>2.</u>	Terms of commission members run from the first day of July. Commission
18		members may be reappointed to the commission. The commission shall elect one
19		of its members as chairman. If a member position becomes vacant, the appointing
20		individual shall appoint a member to complete the remaining term. The terms of
21		the initial commission members may run for a single year as may be necessary to
22		initiate the cycle of two-year terms.
23	<u>Au</u>	thority - Accountability.
24	<u>1.</u>	The commission may apply for, accept, and expend any appropriation, grant, gift,
25		or service made available from public or private sources consistent with the
26		purpose of this chapter.
27	<u>2.</u>	The commission may administer grant programs consistent with the purpose of this
28		chapter, including:
29		a. An innovation grant program;
30		b. A tourism grant program; and
31		c. An international trade grant program.

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1	<u>3.</u>	The department may adopt rules to implement this chapter, including establishing		
2		qualification requirements for any of the grant programs administered under this		
3		chapter.		
4	<u>4.</u>	The commission shall create application forms and shall accept completed		
5		applications.		
6	<u>5.</u>	A grant provided under this chapter is not a business incentive under chapter		
7		54-60.1. As a condition of a grant provided under this chapter, however, the		
8		commission shall require that the recipient repay some or the entire grant if the		
9		recipient does not fulfill the conditions of the grant. Repayment may be monetary		
10		or may be of any other type or method determined by the commission to be in the		
11		public interest.		
12	Cor	mmission meetings - Personnel - Reports. The commission is an office of the		
13	<u>department</u>	of commerce. The commission shall meet as necessary and shall report to each		
14	14 regular session of the legislative assembly. The commission may secure office space, hire			
15	5 consultants, spend any funds appropriated to the commission, and contract with public entities			
16	6 or private parties for services. The commission shall determine necessary qualifications of			
17	personnel.			
18	Cor	nmission member reimbursement and compensation. All members of the		
19	2 commission are entitled to reimbursement for mileage and expenses incurred in the
