SB 2188: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 57-02-27.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the capitalization rate used for valuation and assessment of agricultural lands for property tax purposes; and to provide an effective date.

SB 2189: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 23-01-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the exchange of immunization data.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Human Services Committee**.

Sen. Wardner and Rep. Wald introduced:

SB 2190: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 50-24.1-02.8 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to transfers involving annuities.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry, Business and Labor Committee**.

Sens. Brown, Klein, Robinson and Reps. Carlson, Thorpe, Vigesaa introduced:

SB 2191: A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 51-07-02.1, 51-07-02.2, and 51-07-02.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to contractual relationships between automobile and truck wholesalers and retailers; to amend and reenact section 51-07-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the termination of a contractual relationship between automobile and truck wholesalers and retailers; and to provide for application.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Brown, Christmann, Krauter and Reps. Devlin, Sandvig, Uglem introduced:

SB 2192: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 50-24.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to medical assistance reimbursement of ambulance services.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Human Services Committee**.

Sens. Tallackson, Trenbeath and Reps. Aarsvold, Belter introduced:

SB 2193: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-38 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to income tax withholding from certain pension payments; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sens. Klein, Krebsbach and Reps. Keiser, Wald introduced:

SB 2194: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 26.1-02-21 and 26.1-06.1-31 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to treatment of reinsurance upon insolvency, liquidation, or dissolution and reinsurer's liability in delinquency proceedings.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry, Business and Labor Committee**.

Sens. Krebsbach, Heitkamp, Wardner and Reps. Glassheim, D. Johnson, Maragos introduced:

SB 2195: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 44-08-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reimbursement of lodging expenses and allowances for meals for state and political subdivision officers and employees.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Government and Veterans Affairs Committee**.

Sens. Bowman, Robinson, Wardner and Reps. Hunsakor, Nicholas, Nottestad introduced:

SB 2196: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-38 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an optional contribution by individual income taxpayers for programs and activities conducted by the silver-haired education association; to provide an appropriation; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sens. Mathern, Brown, Krauter and Reps. Conrad, Ekstrom, S. Kelsh introduced:

SB 2197: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 35-20-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a landlord's mobile home lien.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Taylor, Brown, Lyson and Reps. Amerman, DeKrey, Nelson introduced:

SB 2198: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 37-07.1-02, 37-07.1-03, 37-07.1-05, 37-07.1-06.2, 37-07.2-01, and 37-07.2-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to tuition waivers and grants for national guard members.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Government and Veterans Affairs Committee**.

Sens. Brown, G. Lee and Reps. Devlin, Klemin, Kretschmar introduced:

SB 2199: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 28-01-46 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to expert opinion required in certain civil cases.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

Sen. Wardner introduced:

SCR 4009: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study school district funding sources to determine if a method can be found to provide an incentive to reduce school district property tax levies.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sen. Wardner introduced:

SCR 4010: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study alternatives to the current method of expressing property tax levies in mills per dollar of taxable valuation.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sen. Wardner introduced:

SCR 4011: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study assessment and taxation of mobile homes and similar housing alternatives with an emphasis on making assessment and taxation of those housing alternatives equitable in comparison with assessment and taxation of traditional residential housing.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Christmann's motion.
