1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to the provision of services to individuals who are deaf or hearing

3 impaired; to amend and reenact sections 25-07-01, 25-07-04, 25-07-05, 25-07-06, 25-07-08,

4 and 25-07-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the school for the deaf; and to

5 repeal section 25-07-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the reporting of

6 individuals who are deaf or hearing impaired.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 25-07-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 9 10 25-07-01. School for the deaf - Maintained - Location - Purpose. There must be 11 maintained at Devils Lake, in Ramsey County, an institution for the education of the deaf which 12 must be known as the a school for the deaf, which must provide education and training and 13 serve as a resource and referral center for individuals who are deaf or hearing impaired. 14 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 25-07-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 15 amended and reenacted as follows: 16 25-07-04. Qualifications for admission to school for the deaf - Residents of state 17 entitled to free education. Each applicant A child who is a resident of this state and who, because of <u>deafness or a</u> hearing 18 1. 19 impairment, is unable to receive an education in the public schools, is entitled to 20 receive an education in attend the school for the deaf at the expense of the state. 21 The North Dakota school for the deaf serves deaf or hearing impaired children 22 from birth through age A child is entitled to attend the school at any age up to 23 twenty-one.

2		upon request and no child will. A child may not be admitted to the school until the		
3		child's application is completed and approved. Students enrolled must be

5	<u>3.</u>	The school for the deaf shall provide transportation by the school for the deaf as		
6		indicated in the student's to any child who has been admitted, in accordance with		
7		the child's individual education plan.		
8	All deaf or	or hearing-impaired children who are residents of the state are		
9	<u>4.</u>	Any child who is a resident of this state and who is deaf or hearing impaired is		
10		entitled to receive special education and related services based on a completed in		
11		accordance with the child's individual education program, which considers the.		
12		Each individual education program must address the child's academic,		
13		recreational, and leisure needs, as well as the acquisition of independent living		
14		skills, and career and technical education, recreational, and leisure needs of each

16	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 25-07-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
17	amended and reenacted as follows:			
18	25-0	7-05. Admission of nonresidents. Deaf children of suitable age who are not		
19	residents of this state may enroll in A child who is deaf or hearing impaired but who is not a			
20	resident of this state may be admitted to the school for the deaf upon payment in advance of			
21	the, provided the annual cost of the child's education, as determined by the superintendent of			
22	public instruction. Nonresident children, however, may not be received to the exclusion of			
23	children who are residents of this state, is paid on behalf of the child in advance of the child's			
24	admission and on a yearly basis thereafter. The school may not admit a child who is not a			
25	resident of t	his state to the exclusion of a child who is a resident of this state.		
26	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 25-07-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
27	amended ar	nd reenacted as follows:		
28	25-0	77-06. Instruction at school for the deaf. The superintendent of the school for the		
29	deaf shall p	rovide special education and related services designed to meet the unique needs of		
30	each child who is deaf or hearing-impaired students according to, in accordance with the child's			
31	individual education programs as required by federal and state laws and regulations program.			

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SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 25-07-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

25-07-08. Clothing may be furnished when necessary - Accounts for clothing.
The superintendent of the school for the deaf shall furnish suitable clothing to a pupil provide
clothing to a child who is enrolled in the school who otherwise is not provided with the same.
An account, certified as correct by the superintendent, must be made for clothing furnished to
any pupil:

8 1. Against the parent or guardian of such pupil if the pupil is a minor; or

9 2. Against the pupil if the pupil has no parent or guardian or has attained if the child

10 does not have suitable clothing. If the child is a minor, the school shall charge the

11 child's parent or legal guardian for any clothing provided to the child under this

12 section and shall charge the individual for any clothing provided to the individual

13 <u>under this section if the individual has reached</u> the age of majority. An account

14 certified as correct by <u>If</u> the superintendent must be certifies any charges under
 15 this section as being correct, the charges are presumed correct in all courts.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 25-07-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 **25-07-11. Home intervention program.** The school for the deaf may provide a home
19 intervention program for children who are under the age of five and who are deaf or

20 hearing-impaired preschoolers, under the age of five, which must consist of supplying. The

21 program must include information, counseling services, auditory training, and basic language

22 development programs instruction for the parents of such children. This home intervention

program will <u>must</u> be carried out by college or university trained teachers of the deaf, speech
pathologists, or audiologists.

25 **SECTION 7.** A new section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is 26 created and enacted as follows:

- 27 School for the deaf Adult services.
- 28 <u>1.</u> The school for the deaf may provide services to adults who are deaf or hearing
   29 impaired. The services may include:
- 30 <u>a.</u> <u>Consultations;</u>
- 31 <u>b.</u> <u>Evaluations;</u>

6	<u>2.</u>	2. The school for the deaf may assist adults who are deaf or hearing impaired in			
7		<u>obta</u>	aining access to vocational rehabilitation programs, developmental disabilities		
8		prog	grams, aging services, captioned media services, communications services,		
9		and	advocacy services. The school for the deaf may also assist individuals in		
10		<u>obta</u>	aining residential placements in independent living facilities.		
11	SECTION 8. A new section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
12	created and enacted as follows:				
13	Provision of services - Collaboration. The school for the deaf may collaborate with				
14	public and private entities for the provision of services to individuals who are deaf or hearing				
15	impaired.				
16	SECTION 9. A new section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
17	created and enacted as follows:				
18	Data base. The school for the deaf may maintain a data base of individuals who are				
19	deaf or hearing impaired.				
20	SECTION 10. REPEAL. Section 25-07-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
21	repealed.
