- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 20.1-03-07 and section
- 2 20.1-03-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to small game hunting by nonresidents;
- 3 and to repeal section 20.1-08-04.9 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to hunting by
- 4 nonresidents.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 20.1-03-07 of the North Dakota
7	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- Hunt, catch, take, or kill any small game without a nonresident small game license.
   The nonresident small game license entitles the nonresident to hunt small game
- 10 for any period of ten consecutive days or any two periods of five consecutive days
- 11 cach. The hunting period for which the license is valid must be designated on the
- 12 license. A nonresident small game license is not required to hunt waterfowl under
- 13 section 20.1-03-07.1. A nonresident may purchase more than one nonresident
   14 small game license per year.
- 15 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-03-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
  16 amended and reenacted as follows:

20.1-03-12. Schedule of fees for licenses and permits. The various license and

- For a resident an individual, age sixteen and over, small game hunting license, six
   dollars.
- 21 2. For a nonresident small game hunting license, eighty-five dollars.
- 3. For a resident big game hunting license, twenty dollars, except the fee for a
  licensee under age sixteen is ten dollars, except as provided in a gubernatorial
  proclamation issued pursuant to section 20.1-08-04.1.

2		lottery for deer licenses remaining after the second lottery for residents under
3		subsection 4 of section 20.1-03-11, for a nonresident big game hunting license, two
4		hundred dollars, and for a nonresident bow license, two hundred dollars, and a
5		nonrefundable five dollar application fee must accompany any lottery license fee
6		under this subsection, except as provided in a gubernatorial proclamation issued
7		pursuant to section 20.1-08-04.1. For a nonresident who participates on the same
8		basis as a resident in a lottery for deer licenses remaining after the second lottery
9		for residents, fifty dollars.

15	<del>8.</del> <u>7.</u>	For a nonresident short-term seven-day fishing license, twenty dollars.

17	<del>10.</del> <u>9.</u>	For a nonresident nongame hunting license, fifteen dollars.
18	<del>11.</del> <u>10.</u>	For a wild turkey permit, eight dollars.

29	<del>17.</del> <u>16.</u>	For an annual license to practice taxidermy, twenty-five dollars.

31		respective open seasons, not to exceed in any one season twenty-five game birds,

3	<del>19.</del> <u>18.</u>	For a permit to make collections of protected birds and animals for scientific
4		purposes, ten dollars.
5	<del>20.</del> <u>19.</u>	For a motorboat certificate of number and license: Each motorboat under sixteen
6		feet [4.88 meters] in length, and all canoes, regardless of length, powered by a
7		motor, twelve dollars. Each motorboat sixteen feet [4.88 meters] in length and over
8		but shorter than twenty feet [6.1 meters] in length, excluding canoes, twenty-four
9		dollars. Each motorboat twenty feet [6.1 meters] in length or over excluding
10		canoes, thirty-three dollars.
11	<del>21.</del> <u>20.</u>	To operate watercraft used for hire, the following license fees apply for three years:
12		Class 1. Each craft capable of carrying two adults of average weight,
13		six dollars.
14		Class 2. Each craft capable of carrying three adults of average weight,
15		six dollars.
16		Class 3. Each craft capable of carrying four adults of average weight,
17		six dollars.
18		Class 4. Each craft capable of carrying five adults of average weight,
19		six dollars.
20		Class 5. Each craft capable of carrying up to eight adults of average weight,
21		nine dollars.
22		Class 6. Each craft capable of carrying up to ten adults of average weight,
23		twelve dollars.
24		Class 7. Each craft capable of carrying up to fifteen adults of average weight,
25		twenty-four dollars.
26		Class 8. Each craft capable of carrying sixteen or more adults of average weight,
27		thirty dollars.

29		20.1-06-05, fifteen dollars for each hoop-net or trap, and fifteen dollars for each

- 44. 43. For a commercial clam dealer's permit, two thousand dollars. In addition, the
   applicant shall submit to the director a surety bond in the sum of two thousand
   dollars.
- 4 45. <u>44.</u> For an annual nonresident license to sell minnows or other live bait at wholesale,
  5 two hundred dollars.
- 6 46. 45. For a bighorn sheep license issued to a nonresident, five hundred dollars.
- 7 47. 46. For a nonresident reciprocal trapping license, two hundred fifty dollars.
- 8 48. <u>47.</u> For a nonresident spring white goose license, fifty dollars.
- 9 49. 48. For a resident certificate fee, one dollar, and for a nonresident certificate fee, two
- dollars. An agent may not charge a service fee for issuing a resident ornonresident certificate fee.
- 12 The fees for these licenses and permits, except for motorboat license fees, must be deposited
- 13 with the state treasurer and credited to the game and fish fund. Forty-five dollars of each
- 14 nonresident big game hunting license fee must be used for the private land initiative.
- SECTION 3. REPEAL. Section 20.1-08-04.9 of the North Dakota Century Code isrepealed.
