- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the administration of a basic reading literacy test.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## Basic reading literacy test - Reporting of scores - Individual literacy plan.

- 1. After March fifteenth of each school year, the superintendent of public instruction shall administer to public school students in grades one through eight and ten a valid and reliable uniform test of reading literacy that demonstrates grade level achievement. The test must measure reading fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, phonemic awareness, and phonics, and it must be usable for screening, progress monitoring, diagnostics, and outcome results.
- a. Each school district shall report to the superintendent of public instruction before April fifteenth the number and percentage of students at each grade level who read at a particular grade and month level.
  - b. (1) Students who exceed their academic grade and month level by more than five months are termed advanced.
    - (2) Students who meet or are within five months of their academic grade and month level are termed proficient.
    - (3) Students who are below their academic grade and month level by five to nine months are termed partially proficient.
    - (4) Students who are below their academic grade and month level by more than nine months are termed novice.

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- 3. Each school district shall report to the superintendent of public instruction before
  April fifteenth the number and percentage of students who have increased their
  reading literacy grade level by two or more grade levels during one school year.

  4. Each school district shall report each student's test results and the student's
  academic grade and month level in reading literacy to the student's parents.

  - 5. a. If a student's reading literacy skills are more than five months below the student's grade and month level in any of the five measured areas, the student's classroom or English teacher and a reading specialist, if the district employs one, shall work with the student's parents to develop an individual literacy plan for the student. The plan must be reviewed at least annually and must remain in effect until the student's reading literacy skills are determined to be within five months of the student's grade and month level.
    - b. This subsection does not apply to any student who:
      - (1) Has an individualized education program plan that documents a disability shown to be a substantial cause for a student's inability to read and comprehend at grade level; or
      - (2) Is identified as an English language learner.
