- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the commencement of the elementary and secondary school year; and to provide an
- 3 effective date.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-06-04. School calendar - Length.

- 1. During each school year, a school district shall provide for a school calendar of at least one hundred eighty days, apportioned as follows:
 - a. One hundred seventy-three full days of instruction;
 - Three holidays listed in subdivisions b through j of subsection 1 of section
 15.1-06-02 and selected by the school board in consultation with district teachers;
 - c. Two days for the attendance of teachers at the North Dakota education association instructional conference; and
 - d. Up to two full days during which parent-teacher conferences are held or which are deemed by the school board to be compensatory time for parent-teacher conferences held outside regular school hours.
- 2. The school calendar may begin no earlier than the Monday before the first Monday in September.
- 21 3. A full day of instruction consists of:
 - At least five and one-half hours for elementary students, during which time the students are required to be in attendance for the purpose of receiving curricular instruction; and

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1 b. At least six hours for high school students, during which time the students are 2 required to be in attendance for the purpose of receiving curricular instruction. 3 If a school's calendar provides for an extension of each schoolday beyond the 3. <u>4.</u> 4 statutorily required minimum number of hours, and if the extensions when 5 aggregated over an entire school year amount to more than eighty-four hours of 6 additional classroom instruction during the school year, the school is exempt from 7 having to make up six hours of instruction time lost as a result of weather-related 8 closure. In order to make up lost classroom instruction time beyond the six hours, 9 the school must extend its normal school calendar day by at least thirty minutes. 10 A school that does not qualify under the provisions of subsection 3 must extend its 4. <u>5.</u> 11 normal schoolday by at least thirty minutes to make up classroom instruction time 12 lost as a result of weather-related closure. 13 If because of weather a school must dismiss before completing a full day of 5. <u>6.</u> 14 instruction, the school is responsible for making up only those hours and portions of an hour between the time of early dismissal and the conclusion of a full day of 15 16 classroom instruction.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2006.
