4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

State-tribal relations committee - Duties.

- 1. The legislative council, during each biennium, shall appoint a state-tribal relations committee in the same manner as the council appoints other interim committees.
- 2. In addition to the legislative members appointed by the legislative council, the following serve as ex officio nonvoting members:
 - a. The executive director of the Indian affairs commission;
- b. The chairman of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe, or the chairman's designee;
- 14 c. The chairman of the Spirit Lake Tribe, or the chairman's designee;
- d. The chairman of the Three Affiliated Tribes, or the chairman's designee;
 - e. The chairman of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians, or the chairman's designee; and
 - f. The chairman of the Sisseton-Wahpeton Sioux Tribe, or the chairman's designee.
- 20 3. The council shall designate the chairman of the committee.
- The committee shall operate according to the statutes and procedures governing
 the operation of other legislative council interim committees.
 - 5. The non-legislative members of the committee are not entitled to compensation and reimbursement for expenses, except the executive director of the Indian affairs

10		d.	Studying federal and state rules regarding health care and water issues; and
11		e.	Identifying common bonds and proposing legislation for the mutual benefit of
12			the state and the tribes.

14	and after that date is ineffective.
