- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 50-24.6-02 and section
- 2 50-24.6-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the membership of the drug use
- 3 review board and the prior authorization program.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 50-24.6-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 2. The board consists of fifteen sixteen members. The pharmacy administrator of the department and the medical consultant to the department are ex officio nonvoting board members who shall provide administrative services to the board. The executive director of the department shall appoint the remaining thirteen board members. A majority of the appointed members must be physicians and pharmacists participating in the medical assistance program. Four or more of the appointed members must have experience with a drug use review process or have participated in programs in which prior authorization is used. The appointed members of the board must be:
 - a. Six Four physicians licensed in this state and actively engaged in the practice of medicine, one of whom is a psychiatrist, and four of whom are chosen from a list of nominees provided appointed by the North Dakota medical association;
 - b. Six Two physicians licensed in this state and actively engaged in the practice
 of medicine, appointed by the executive director of the department;
 - <u>c.</u> Four pharmacists licensed in this state and actively engaged in the practice of pharmacy, four of whom are chosen from a list of nominees provided
 <u>appointed</u> by the North Dakota pharmaceutical association; and

1 Two pharmacists licensed in this state and actively engaged in the practice of d. 2 pharmacy, appointed by the executive director of the department; 3 One individual who represents consumer interests, appointed by the e. 4 governor; and 5 One pharmacist or physician representing the pharmaceutical industry who is c. f. 6 chosen appointed by the executive director of the department from a list of 7 nominees provided to the executive director by the pharmaceutical research 8 manufacturers of America. 9 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.6-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 11 50-24.6-04. Prior authorization program. 12 The department shall develop and implement a prior authorization program that 13 meets the requirements of 42 U.S.C. 1396r-8(d) to determine coverage of drug 14 products when a medical assistance recipient's health care provider prescribes a drug that is identified as requiring prior authorization. Authorization must be 15 16 granted for provision of the drug if: 17 The drug not requiring prior authorization has not been effective, or with 18 reasonable certainty is not expected to be effective, in treating the recipient's 19 condition; 20 b. The drug not requiring prior authorization causes or is reasonably expected to 21 cause adverse or harmful reactions to the health of the recipient; or 22 The drug is prescribed for a medically accepted use supported by a C. 23 compendium or by approved product labeling unless there is a therapeutically 24 equivalent drug that is available without prior authorization. 25 2. For any drug placed on the prior authorization program, the department shall 26 provide medical and clinical criteria, cost information, and utilization data to the 27 drug use review board for review and consideration. The board may consider 28 department data and information from other sources to make a decision about 29 placement of the drug on prior authorization. 30 3. The department may not prior authorize or otherwise restrict single-source or 31 brand name antipsychotic, antidepressant, or other medications used to treat

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1 mental illnesses, such as schizophrenia, depression, or bipolar disorder, and drugs 2 prescribed for the treatment of: 3 Acquired immune deficiency syndrome or human immunodeficiency virus; and <u>a.</u> 4 b. Cancer. 5 The department may use contractors to collect and analyze the documentation 6 required under this section and to facilitate the prior authorization program. 7 The department shall consult with the board in the course of adopting rules to 4. 5. 8 implement the prior authorization program. The rules must: 9 Establish policies and procedures necessary to implement the prior a. 10 authorization program. 11 b. Develop a process that allows prescribers to furnish documentation required 12 to obtain approval for a drug without interfering with patient care activities. 13 Allow the board to establish panels of physicians and pharmacists which C. 14 provide expert guidance and recommendations to the board in considering 15 specific drugs or therapeutic classes of drugs to be included in the prior 16 authorization program.
