1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 51-05.1-01.1, 60-02-03, 60-02-09, 60-02-09.1,

2 and 60-04-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a bonding fund for auctioneers and

3 grain warehousemen; to repeal section 60-04-03.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating

4 to joinder of a surety; and to provide a continuing appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 51-05.1-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code 7 is amended and reenacted as follows:

51-05.1-01.1. Auctioneer's license - Clerk's license - Fees - Bonds Bonding fund <u>Continuing appropriation</u>.

10 The initial application for an annual auctioneer's or clerk's license must be in 1. 11 writing, verified, and must show the name, residence, and address of the applicant. 12 An application must be filed at least ten days prior to before the first auction sale 13 the applicant is to conduct or clerk. Application for renewal of an annual license 14 must be on forms designated by the commission. The fee for the annual license or renewal is thirty-five dollars and must accompany the application. The name and 15 16 license number must appear on all advertising of sales conducted by an auctioneer 17 or clerk. Renewals that are not received by January thirty-first must be assessed 18 an additional twenty-five dollar fee.

Before a license is issued to an auctioneer or auction clerk, the applicant must file
<u>purchase</u> a corporate surety bond with from the commission. This bond must
provide annual coverage of not less than five thousand dollars for an auctioneer or
ten thousand dollars for an auction clerk, must run to the state of North Dakota,
and must be for the benefit of any person injured by the licensee's improper
conduct. Bonds may not be canceled on less than sixty days' written notice to the

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1		commission. The size of the licensee's bond must be clearly and prominently			
2		stated in all contracts with sellers.			
3	<u>3.</u>	There is created in the state treasury the auctioneer bonding fund. The			
4		commission shall set premiums and otherwise administer the fund. Moneys in the			
5		fund and the interest earned on the fund are appropriated on a continuing basis to			
6		the commission to carry out the purposes of this chapter. Upon the request of the			
7		commission, the state investment board shall invest the moneys in the fund in			
8		accordance with chapter 21-10.			
9	SE	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 60-02-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
10	amended and reenacted as follows:				
11	60-	02-03. Duties and powers of the commission. The commission shall have has

14		handling, weighing, and storing of grain, and the management of public

18	3.	Examine and inspect, during ordinary business hours, any licensed warehouse,			
19		including all books, documents, and records.			
20	4.	Require the filing of reports pertaining to the operation of the warehouse.			
21	5.	Set premiums and otherwise administer a bonding fund for public warehousemen.			
22	<u>6.</u>	Make all proper rules for carrying out and enforcing any law in this state regarding			
23		public warehouses.

specific amount for each.

There is created in the state treasury the grain warehousemen bonding fund.
 Moneys in the fund and interest on the fund are appropriated on a continuing basis
 to the commission to carry out the purposes of this chapter. Upon request of the
 commission, the state investment board shall invest the moneys in the fund in

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 60-02-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

14 60-02-09.1. Bond cancellation - Release of surety. The surety on a bond bonding 15 fund is released from all future liability accruing on the bond after the expiration of ninety days 16 from the date of receipt by the commission of notice of cancellation by the surety or on a later 17 date specified by the surety commission. This provision does not operate to relieve, release, or 18 discharge the surety bonding fund from any liability already accrued or which accrues before 19 the expiration of the ninety-day period. Unless the warehouseman files a new bond suitable substitute for a bond at least thirty days before liability ceases, the commission, without hearing, 20 21 shall immediately shall suspend the warehouseman's license and the suspension may not be 22 removed until a new bond suitable substitute for a bond has been filed and approved by the 23 commission. When a license is so suspended, the warehouseman shall give notice of such the 24 suspension to each receiptholder having grain stored in the warehouse. The warehouseman 25 shall further notify each receiptholder having grain stored in the warehouse that the grain must 26 be removed from the warehouse or it will be priced and redeemed in cash in accordance with 27 section 60-02-41.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 60-04-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

30 **60-04-06.** Commission to marshall trust assets.

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1	<u>1.</u>	Upon its appointment by the district court, the commission may maintain suits at
2		law or in equity, actions or use any special proceeding, in the name of the state of
3		North Dakota , upon its own relation, but for the benefit of all such receiptholders
4		against:
5	1.	The <u>the</u> insurers of grain ;
6	2.	The warehouseman's bond;
7	3.	Any, the person who may have converted any grain;, or
8	4.	Any the receiptholder who shall have received more than its the just and pro rata
9		share of grain ,
10	<u>2.</u>	The commission shall bring these actions for the purpose of marshalling all of the
11		trust fund assets and distributing the same assets among the receiptholders. The
12		commission shall seek possession of any grain in the warehouse before recourse
13		is had against the insurers of grain, and the remedy against the insurers of grain
14		shall be exhausted before recourse is had against the bond, and against the bond
15		before recourse is had against the person honestly converting grain, unless the
16		commission shall deem it necessary to the redemption of the receipts that all the
17		above remedies be pursued at the same time.
18	SEC	CTION 6. REPEAL. Section 60-04-03.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is

19 repealed.
