- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-32-01, 43-32-03, 43-32-07, 43-32-08,
- 2 43-32-08.1, 43-32-08.2, 43-32-12, 43-32-13, 43-32-14, 43-32-17, 43-32-19, 43-32-20,
- 3 43-32-20.1, 43-32-23, 43-32-25, 43-32-26, 43-32-27, 43-32-27.1, 43-32-30, and 43-32-32 of
- 4 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners
- 5 licensure of industrial-organizational psychologists; to provide a penalty; and to provide an
- 6 effective date.

### 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 **43-32-01. Definitions.**
- 1. "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.
- <u>"Industrial-organizational psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under</u>
   this chapter to engage in the practice of industrial-organizational psychology.
- <u>"Industrial-organizational psychology" means the provision of psychological</u>
   <u>research services or consultation services to a group or an organization. The term</u>
   does not include the delivery or supervision of services to individuals who are
- themselves, rather than the group or organization, the intended beneficiaries of the
   services, regardless of the source or extent of payment for services rendered.
- 19 <u>4.</u> "Licensee" means an industrial-organizational psychologist or a psychologist.
- 5. "Practice of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation,
   interpretation, or modification of human behavior by the application of
   psychological principles, methods, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or
   eliminating symptomatic, maladaptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing
   interpersonal relationships, work and life adjustment, personal effectiveness,

1		behavioral health, and mental health. The term includes psychological testing and
2		the evaluation or assessment of personal characteristics, such as intelligence,
3		personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and neuropsychological functioning;
4		counseling, psychotherapy, and other therapeutic techniques based on
5		psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and emotional disorder
6		or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as well as of the
7		psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability; and
8		psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term
9		includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, groups, and the
10		public regardless of whether payment is received for services rendered.

12		practice of psychology.

- 4. <u>7.</u> "Psychology resident" means an individual who has received from an accredited <u>a</u>
  school or college a doctorate degree in a program of study substantially
  psychological in nature, and who is involved in supervised psychological
  employment.
- 5. 8. "School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning that
   which is accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time
   graduate course of study in industrial-organizational psychology or psychology.

20 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-03. Tenure of members - Vacancies and oath of office. The term of office of
each member of the board is three years and until a successor is appointed and qualified. The
governor shall fill all vacancies by appointment. In case of a vacancy before the expiration of a
term, the appointment must be for the remainder of the term only. A person <u>An individual</u>
appointed to the board qualifies by taking the oath required of civil officers.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-07. Meetings of board - Seal of board. The board shall hold at least one
regular meeting each year. Additional meetings may be held upon call of the president or at

1 the written request of the governor or of any two members of the board. The meetings must be 2 held at such places as the board may designate. The board shall must have a seal. 3 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 amended and reenacted as follows: 5 **43-32-08.** Rules and regulations. The board may, from time to time, adopt such rules 6 and regulations not inconsistent with law, as may be necessary to enable it the board to carry 7 into effect the provisions of this chapter, which. The rules may include a code of ethics for 8 psychologists in the state licensees. The board shall adopt rules defining what programs of 9 study are substantially psychological in nature; what educational programs are acceptable for 10 the licensing of psychologists; and what educational programs are acceptable for the licensing 11 of industrial-organizational psychologists. The educational program rules for 12 industrial-organizational psychologists must take into account the availability of professionally 13 accredited programs in the field of industrial-organizational psychology. 14 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 15 16 43-32-08.1. Continuing education requirements. The board shall adopt rules 17 establishing requirements for the continuing education of psychologists licensees. The board 18 may refuse to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license issued 19 under this chapter if the licensee fails to meet applicable continuing education requirements. 20 Applicants for accreditation of continuing education courses, classes, or activities may be 21 charged a reasonable fee determined by the board. 22 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 amended and reenacted as follows: 24 43-32-08.2. Continuing education requirements - Renewal. Absent a showing of 25 good cause, the board may not renew a license issued under this chapter without proof the 26 continuing education requirements established by rule of the board under section 43-32-08.1

27 have been met. A person An individual whose license is not renewed because of failure to

28 meet the continuing education requirements must be reinstated and the license renewed if,

29 within one year from the date of nonrenewal, the person individual demonstrates to the

30 secretary of the board the continuing education requirements have been satisfied and, pays the

31 renewal fee, and pays a late fee to be determined by rule of the board.

1 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **43-32-12.** Application and license fee. The board shall adopt rules establishing the 4 amount of the application fee for licensing licensure by written and oral examination and by 5 reciprocity must be determined by regulation of the board. No A fee is not refundable, in whole or in part, except for failure of the board to hold examinations at the time originally announced, 6 7 in which event the entire fee must be refunded upon demand by the applicant.

8 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 43-32-13. Annual license and fee. Before January first of each year, every licensed 11 psychologist in the state licensee shall pay to the secretary of the board an annual license fee 12 determined by the board not to exceed one hundred dollars. The secretary of the board, upon 13 receipt of payment of the annual license fee by a person licensed under this chapter, shall 14 issue the licensee a certificate of annual license. A person An individual may not hold out as 15 an industrial-organizational psychologist or a licensed psychologist until the annual license fee 16 is paid. The board may deny renewal of the license of a person an individual who violates this 17 section. Annually, the board shall mail a renewal notice to all licensed psychologists each 18 licensee at the address on file with the board.

19 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is 20 amended and reenacted as follows:

21 43-32-14. Payment of delinquent license fees - Reinstatement. A person who has 22 been a licensed psychologist in this state An individual whose license issued under this chapter 23 and whose license has been was revoked for failure to pay the annual license fee must be 24 reinstated and the license renewed if, within one year from the date of revocation, the person 25 individual pays to the secretary of the board the amount of the annual license fees in default 26 and a late fee in the amount of twenty dollars.

27 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is 28 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-17. License required for practice - Titles.

30 1. Except as otherwise provided by under this chapter, no individual a person may 31 not engage in the practice of psychology or represent that individual person to be

1		a psychologist in this state <del>after August 1, 1993,</del> unless that <u>person is an</u> individual
2		has obtained from the board a license to do so who is licensed as a psychologist
3		under this chapter. Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, a person may
4		not engage in the practice of industrial-organizational psychology or represent that
5		person to be an industrial-organizational psychologist in this state unless that
6		person is an individual who is licensed as a psychologist or an
7		industrial-organizational psychologist under this chapter.
8	<u>2.</u>	A psychologist may use the title "psychologist" or similar title in conjunction with
9		the practice of psychology. An industrial-organizational psychologist may use the
10		title "industrial psychologist", "organizational psychologist", or
11		"industrial-organizational psychologist" in conjunction with the practice of
12		industrial-organizational psychology. An industrial-organizational psychologist may
13		not use the title "psychologist" or similar title representing that the individual is
14		licensed as a psychologist.

30			(2) The board may adopt rules to establish who is qualified to perform	
31			supervision, supervision requirements, and reporting.	

SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-20.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 43-32-20.1. Postdoctoral supervised psychological employment. 4 <del>1.</del> This section applies to postdoctoral supervised psychological employment. 5 Supervision may only be performed by a licensed psychologist with a competency 6 in supervision in professional psychology in the area of practice being supervised. 7 <del>2.</del> Supervision of an applicant for psychologist licensure as a licensed psychologist 8 must include at least two hours of regularly scheduled direct supervision a week 9 for full-time employment, one hour of which must be with the supervisor on a 10 one-to-one basis. The remaining hour may be with other mental health 11 professionals designated by the supervisor. The board may approve an exception 12 to the weekly supervision requirement for a week when during which the 13 supervisor was ill or otherwise unable to provide supervision. The board may 14 prorate the two hours per week of supervision for persons individuals preparing for 15 licensure on a part-time basis. 16 The board may adopt rules regarding postdoctoral psychology supervision <del>3.</del> 17 requirements and reporting. 18 SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is 19 amended and reenacted as follows: 20 **43-32-23.** Scope and grading of examination. The board shall determine the subject 21 and scope of specialized psychological areas and techniques for examination. Written 22 examinations may be supplemented by such oral examinations as the board may determine 23 necessary. The board shall determine an acceptable level of performance for each 24 examination and a majority decision of the board is required for the issuing of a license. To 25 ensure impartiality, the written examination must be identified by numbers and no paper may 26 be marked in the name of any applicant, but must be anonymously graded by the board.

SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-25. Retention of examination records. The board shall keep the written
examination papers and score report, an accurate recording of the questions and answers
relating to the oral examinations, and the grade assigned to each answer thereof as a part of its

1	the board's records for at least two years subsequent to following the date of the examination.
2	In addition, the board shall keep a permanent record of all written examination score reports.
3	SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-26 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amended and reenacted as follows:
5	43-32-26. Issuance and display of license. The board is the sole agency
6	empowered to examine competence in the practice of psychology. Such <u>A</u> license certificate
7	issued by the board must show the full name of the licensee, have a serial number and, be
8	signed by the president of the board, and be attested by the secretary under the board's
9	adopted seal. The license issued by the board under the provisions of this chapter must be
10	prominently displayed at the principal place of business where at which the psychologist
11	licensee practices.
12	SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is
13	amended and reenacted as follows:
14	43-32-27. Denial - Revocation or suspension of license - Grounds.
15	1. The board, after notice and, hearing, and by an affirmative vote of at least a
16	majority of board members, may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend any
17	<del>psychologist</del> license issued or applied for under this chapter <del>, or</del> and may otherwise
18	discipline a licensed psychologist, licensee or an applicant upon proof the
19	applicant or licensed psychologist licensee:
20	a. Has been convicted of an offense determined by the board to have a direct
21	bearing upon a person's an individual's ability to serve the public as a
22	psychologist or industrial-organizational psychologist, or when if the board
23	finds, after the conviction of any offense, that a person an individual is not
24	sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1.
25	b. Is using any narcotic or alcoholic beverage to an extent or in a manner
26	dangerous to the <del>psychologist</del> applicant or licensee, any other person, or the
27	public, or to an extent that the use impairs the psychologist's applicant's or
28	licensee's ability to perform the work of a professional psychologist practice of
29	psychology or industrial-organizational psychology with safety to the public.

1		c.	Has impersonated another <del>person</del> individual holding a psychology or
2			industrial-organizational psychology license or allowed another person to use
3			the <del>psychologist's</del> <u>licensee's</u> license.
4		d.	Has used fraud or deception in applying for a license or in taking an
5			examination under this chapter.
6		e.	Has allowed the psychologist's licensee's name or license issued under this
7			chapter to be used in connection with any person who performs psychological
8			services outside of the area of that person's training, experience, or
9			competence.
10		f.	Is legally adjudicated insane or mentally incompetent. The record of the
11			adjudication is conclusive evidence of that fact.
12		g.	Has engaged in any form of unethical conduct as defined in ethical principles
13			of psychologists and code of conduct as adopted and published by the
14			American psychological association, 1992, or revised editions if adopted by
15			the board by rule.
16		h.	Has become grossly negligent in the practice of the profession psychology or
17			industrial-organizational psychology.
18		i.	Has willfully or negligently violated this chapter.
19		j.	Has engaged in an act in violation of rules adopted by the board.
20	2.	<del>A p</del>	erson An individual whose license has been revoked under this section may
21		rea	oply for <del>licensing</del> licensure after two years have elapsed from the date of
22		revo	ocation.

27		lice	nsee may file a written complaint with the board citing the specific allegations of

29		lice	nsee of the complaint and request a written response from the psychologist
30		lice	nsee.

- The board may investigate a complaint on its the board's own motion, without
   requiring the identity of the complainant to be made a matter of public record, if the
   board concludes that good cause exists for preserving the confidentiality of the
   complainant.
- 3. A psychologist licensee who is the subject of an investigation by the board shall
  cooperate fully with the investigation. Cooperation includes responding fully and
  promptly to any reasonable question raised by or on behalf of the board relating to
  the subject of the investigation, and providing copies of patient or client records
  when if reasonably requested by the board and accompanied by the appropriate
  release.
- 11 4. In order to pursue an investigation, the board may subpoena and examine 12 witnesses and records, including patient and client records, and may copy, 13 photograph, or take samples of the records. The board may require the licensed 14 psychologist licensee to give statements under oath, to submit to a physical or 15 psychological examination, or both, by a physician or other qualified evaluation 16 professional selected by the board, if requiring an examination is in the best 17 interest of the public. The patient and client records released to the board are not 18 public records.
- 5. Unless a patient <u>or client</u> release is on file allowing the release of information at the public hearing, patient <u>and client</u> records acquired by the board in <u>its</u> <u>the board's</u>
  investigation are confidential and closed to the public. All board meetings at which patient <u>or client</u> testimony or records are taken or reviewed are confidential and closed to the public. If <del>no</del> patient <u>or client</u> testimony or records are <u>not</u> taken or reviewed, the remainder of the meeting is an open meeting unless a specific exemption is otherwise applicable.

# 26 **SECTION 19. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is 27 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-30. Persons exempt from this chapter. This chapter does not apply to:
Any person individual in the employ of any federal, state, county or municipal agency, or other political subdivision, or any nonprofit corporation or educational institution presently chartered by this state, insofar as the activities and services of

1 the person individual are a part of the duties of the person's office or position with 2 such agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution. This exemption is not available 3 or effective after July 1, 2001. However, the exemption period may be extended 4 by the board in individual cases where hardship or other good cause is shown by 5 the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution covered, or where the person 6 individual affected has received from a school or college a master's degree in 7 psychology and the <del>person's</del> individual's activities and services with such agency, 8 nonprofit corporation, or institution are performed under the supervision of a 9 licensed psychologist. After reviewing the exemption under this subsection, the 10 board and the department of human services shall review their definitions and 11 rules for a master's degree in psychology as used in their own credential 12 requirements. 13 2. A student or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology or 14 industrial-organizational psychology at a school or college, if the activities and 15 services are a part of the person's individual's supervised course of study, 16 provided the student or intern does not use the title "psychologist" or

- 17 <u>"industrial-organizational psychologist"</u> and the student or intern status is clearly
  18 stated.
- A nonresident licensed or certified in the state of the person's individual's
   residence who does not practice psychology <u>or industrial-organizational</u>
   <u>psychology</u> in this state for a period of more than thirty days in any calendar year.
- A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title
   when lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not
   engage in the practice of psychology <u>or industrial-organizational psychology</u> unless
   the lecturer is licensed to practice psychology in this state under this chapter.
- 5. A person An individual employed by a public school and whose if that individual's activities and services are restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment. This exemption applies only when if the person individual has received a master's degree in school psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must be established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public instruction.

1	6.	A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
2		profession, whose the scope of practice of which is consistent with the accepted
3		standards of that person's profession and who does. A person claiming an
4		exemption under this subsection may not represent to be rendering psychological
5		services.
6	7.	An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational

An applicant licensed to practice psychology <u>or industrial-organizational</u>
psychology in another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application
<u>in this state</u>, if the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of
the applicant's intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the
applicant adheres to the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the
board.

- 8. A person employed by an agency, <u>a</u> nonprofit corporation, or <u>an</u> institution <del>who</del> <u>if</u>
  that person is currently exempt from licensure. A person exempt under this
  <u>subsection</u> continues to be exempt if the person continues employment in the
  same position with the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for
  and received the exemption.

 A psychologist psychology resident performing services supervised as provided under section 43-32-20.1.

SECTION 20. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-32. Drugs - Medicine. Nothing in this This chapter may not be construed as
 permitting psychologists licensed under this chapter a licensee to administer or prescribe
 drugs, or in any manner engage in the practice of medicine as defined by the laws of this state.
 SECTION 21. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 10 of this Act becomes effective on
 January 1, 2006.
