- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 14-03 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to premarital counseling; and to amend and reenact section 14-03-22 of
- 3 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to marriage license fees.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 14-03-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 14-03-22. Marriage license fee - Supplemental fee - Fee for marriage ceremony 8 Duties of officers.

9	<u>1.</u>	For the issuance and filing of a marriage license, the recorder, unless the board of
10		county commissioners designates a different official, shall collect the sum of six
11		seventy-one dollars from the party applying for the license, but if the applicant has
12		completed at least twelve hours of premarital counseling, the recorder or
13		designated official shall collect the sum of six dollars. To qualify for the reduced
14		license fee, the applicant must submit to the recorder or designated official a
15		signed and dated certificate that indicates the completion by the applicant of
16		premarital counseling that meets the requirement of section 2 of this Act. The
17		recorder, or designated official, shall prescribe and furnish the form that is to be
18		completed by the individual who certifies that the applicant has completed the
19		premarital counseling.
20	<u>2.</u>	In addition to the license fee or reduced license fee provided for in subsection 1,
21		the recorder, or designated official, shall also collect from the applicant a
22		supplemental fee of twenty-nine dollars for aid to victims of domestic violence

through the domestic violence prevention fund in accordance with chapter 14-07.1.

- 1 For performing a marriage ceremony during regular courthouse hours, the 3. 2 recorder, or designated official, shall collect a fee of thirty dollars which is to be 3 retained by the county. If the marriage ceremony is performed at a time other than 4 during regular courthouse hours, the recorder, or designated official, may collect 5 and retain a fee in an amount to be determined by the recorder, or designated 6 official. 7 Except as provided in this section, all collected fees must be deposited monthly 4. 8 with the county treasurer. The county treasurer shall forward the amount 9 represented by supplemental fees to the state treasurer by the fifteenth of each 10 month for crediting to the domestic violence prevention fund.
- 11 The recorder, or designated official, shall prepare a copy of the license and 5. 12 certificate and transmit them to the registrar of vital statistics who shall record them 13 in a book of records kept in the registrar's office for that purpose. The registrar 14 shall index the records and upon request shall issue certified copies of the 15 recorded license and certificate for a one dollar fee. The registrar shall keep an 16 accurate account of these fees and shall turn them over to the state treasurer by 17 the fifteenth of each month for crediting to the general fund.
- 18 SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 14-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 19 created and enacted as follows:

Premarital counseling.

- 21 To obtain a certificate indicating the completion of premarital counseling as 1. 22 provided in section 14-03-22, the parties to the marriage must receive premarital 23 counseling. For the purposes of this section, "premarital counseling" means one or 24 more meetings, totaling at least twelve hours, between two parties who are eligible 25 to enter a marriage contract and have either made application for a marriage 26 license or intend to apply for a marriage license, and one or more neutral parties, 27 for purposes of discussing the rights, expectations, needs, obligations, and other 28 commitments incident to the marriage contract, including discussion about children, 29 finances, relationships with new family members and friends, time management, 30 goalsetting, and communication and conflict resolution skills.
- 31 Premarital counseling may be provided by any of the following: 2.

1		a. <u>A member of the clergy;</u>
2		b. Staff of a church, including a church volunteer sponsoring couple, or other
3		religious organization with training in premarital counseling; or
4		c. <u>A trained or certified counselor.</u>
5	<u>3.</u>	The completion of the certificate required under section 14-03-22 by the individual
6		performing the counseling constitutes a certification that the parties have been
7		counseled.
