12 The governing body of any political subdivision may appropriate money for the 1. 13 control of pests under this chapter or section 63-01.1-04.2 chapter 63-01.1. If 14 state funds are involved, the money must be expended according to control plans 15 approved by the commissioner. The governing body of a political subdivision shall 16 determine the portion, if any, of control program costs that should be paid by the 17 political subdivision. Costs of the control program may be paid by moneys in the 18 emergency fund. If the emergency fund is not sufficient to carry out the program, 19 the governing body may expend money from the general fund and in this event the 20 governing body, except the governing body of a park district, upon approval of sixty 21 percent of those voting in any special election or the next regularly scheduled 22 primary or general election, may levy a tax during the following year upon all 23 taxable property in the political subdivision to fully reimburse the general fund for

1		the amount expended except that the levy may not exceed the limitation in
2		subsection 1 of section 57-15-28.1.

2		including the entire area within the right of way. A highway in a rural area may be
3		called a "road" and a highway in an urban area may be called a "street".

5		statutory authority or otherwise. The term does not include a lessee, renter,
6		tenant, operator, or an owner of any easement or right of way.

8		and which is determined by the commissioner after consulting with the North
9		Dakota state university extension service, or which is determined by a county

17		subdivision thereof, or any other entity which occupies or owns land or which

20	12.	"Pest" means any pest defined in section 4-33-01 and includes a prairie dog.
21	13.	"Township road" means a <u>an improved</u> public road that is an improved road, <u>not</u>
22		located in an incorporated city and not designated as part of a county, state, or
23		federal-aid road system, but constructed, maintained, graded, and drained by the
24		township, or county in the case of an unorganized township. A township road
25		includes a street in an unincorporated townsite and; does not necessarily have to

24	<u>2.</u>	If a control authority finds that land within a city is infested with pests, the control		
25		authority may direct the city weed control officer to serve the landowner, either		
26		personally or by certified mail, with written notice requiring the landowner to control		
27		or eradicate the pests within a prescribed time period. The landowner may request		
28		additional time from the city weed board. The notice must state that the landowner		
29		may be subject to the penalties provided in section 63-01.1-15 if the landowner		
30		fails to comply. The notice must specify minimal remedial requirements. A copy of		
31		the notice may be sent by certified mail to any tenant, lessee, or operator of the		

1		land. If the city weed board will control or eradicate the pests upon failure of the
2		landowner to do so, the notice must include a statement of costs. If the landowner
3		does not control or eradicate the pests within the time specified, the city weed
4		control officer may cause the pests to be controlled or eradicated and the
5		expenses charged against the land. These expenses are part of the taxes to be
6		levied against the land for the ensuing year and must be collected in the same
7		manner as other real estate taxes. If the city weed board intends to control or
8		eradicate the pests, the notice must include a statement informing the landowner
9		that the landowner may request that the city weed board not control or eradicate
10		the pests. If the landowner requests that the city weed board not control or
11		eradicate the pests, the board may not control or eradicate the pests until the city
12		weed board, by a majority vote, authorizes the control or eradication.
13	SE	CTION 35. A new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is

16	<u>1.</u>	The commissioner shall attempt to arrange a pest control or eradication program

20		arrange a pest control or eradication program with all political subdivisions owning
21		or controlling public land within the county weed control officer's jurisdiction.

23		attempt to arrange a pest control or eradication program with all political
24		subdivisions owning or controlling public land within the corporate limits of the city.
25	<u>4.</u>	Each state agency shall provide for the control or eradication of pests on any land
26		within the agency's jurisdiction. If a state agency fails to control or eradicate pests
27		on land under its jurisdiction, the county weed board for the county in which all or a
28		portion of the land is located, upon approval of the commissioner, may enter upon
29		the land to control or eradicate the pests. The state agency shall reimburse the
30		county weed board for expenses incurred in the control or eradication of pests
31		within thirty days after the agency receives the bill.

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1	<u>5.</u>	Each feo	deral agency shall develop a management plan for controlling or	
2		eradicat	ing pests on land within the agency's jurisdiction. If a federal agency does	
3		not cont	rol or eradicate pests and does not develop a management plan for

5		agency	as provided in section 63-01.1-08. The federal agency shall provide a	
6		report to	the control authority detailing the methods used by the federal agency and	
7		<u>showing</u>	cause why the federal agency is not controlling or eradicating the pests.	
8		The con	nmissioner may specify the forms on which the federal agency report must	
9		<u>be subm</u>	nitted.	
10	<u>6.</u>	Upon be	ing notified by a county weed board of a federal agency's failure to control	
11		or eradio	cate pests, the commissioner may hold a public hearing to determine the	
12		<u>reason f</u>	or the agency's failure.
