- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section 49-01-01 and sections
- 2 49-02-01, 49-02-01.1, 49-03-01, 49-03-01.3, 49-03-01.4, 49-03-01.5, 49-03-02, 49-03-05, and
- 3 49-20-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to jurisdiction of the public service
- 4 commission over electric cooperatives.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 49-02-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 49-02-01.1. Jurisdiction of commission limited as to certain utilities. Nothing in 9 this chapter or in chapter 49-21 authorizes the commission to make any order affecting rates, 10 contracts, services rendered, adequacy, or sufficiency of facilities, or the rules or regulations of 11 any public utility owned and operated by the state or by any city, county, township, or other 12 political subdivision of the state or any telecommunications public utility, that is not operated for 13 profit, that is operated as a nonprofit, cooperative, or mutual telecommunications company or is 14 a telecommunications company having fewer than eight thousand local exchange subscribers. 15 However, any telecommunications utility that is operated as a nonprofit, cooperative, or mutual 16 telecommunications company or has fewer than eight thousand local exchange subscribers is 17 subject to sections 49-21-01.4, 49-21-02.4, 49-21-08, 49-21-23, 49-21-24, and 49-21-25, 18 subsections 6 through 14 of section 49-21-01.7, and to sections 49-21-01.2, 49-21-01.3, 19 49-21-06, 49-21-07, 49-21-09, and 49-21-10, regarding rates, terms, and conditions of access 20 services or connection between facilities and transfer of telecommunications between two or 21 more telecommunications companies. Nothing in this section limits the authority of the 22 commission under chapter 49-03.1 or sections 49-04-05 and 49-04-06. 23 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 49-03-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

49-03-01. Certificate of public convenience and necessity - Secured by electric
public utility. No An electric public utility henceforth shall may not begin construction or
operation of a public utility plant or system, or of an extension of a plant or system, except as
provided below, without first obtaining from the commission a certificate that public convenience
and necessity require or will require such the construction and operation. This section does not
require an electric public utility to secure a certificate for an extension within any <u>a</u> municipality
within which it has lawfully commenced operations. If any <u>an</u> electric public utility in

1 constructing or extending its line, plant, or system, unreasonably interferes with or is about to 2 interfere unreasonably with the service or system of any other another electric public utility, or 3 any electric cooperative corporation, the commission, on complaint of the electric public utility 4 or the electric cooperative corporation claiming to be injuriously affected, after notice and 5 hearing as provided in this title, may order enforcement of this section with respect to the 6 offending electric public utility and prescribe just and reasonable terms and conditions. 7 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 49-03-01.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 49-03-01.3. Exclusions from limitations on electric distribution lines, extension,

10 and service and on issuance of certificates of public convenience and necessity. 11 Sections 49-03-01 through 49-03-01.5 shall may not be construed to require any such an 12 electric public utility to secure such an order or certificate for an extension of its electric 13 distribution lines within the corporate limits of any a municipality within which it has lawfully 14 commenced operations; provided, however, that such the extension or extensions shall does 15 not interfere with existing services provided by a rural electric cooperative or another an electric 16 public utility within such the municipality; and provided duplication of services is not deemed 17 unreasonable by the commission.

18 Sections 49-03-01 through 49-03-01.5 shall may not be construed to require an electric 19 public utility to discontinue service to its customers thereof whose places receiving service are 20 located outside the corporate limits of a municipality on July 1, 1965; provided, however, that 21 within ninety days after July 1, 1965, any an electric public utility furnishing service to 22 customers whose places receiving service are located outside the corporate limits of a 23 municipality shall file with the commission a complete map or maps of its electric distribution 24 system showing all places in North Dakota which are located outside the corporate limits of a 25 municipality and which are receiving its service as of July 1, 1965. After ninety days from 26 July 1, 1965, unless a customer whose place being served is located outside the corporate 27 limits of a municipality is shown on said the map or maps, it shall be is conclusively presumed 28 that such the customer was not being served on July 1, 1965, and cannot be served until after 29 compliance with the provisions of section 49-03-01.1.

30 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 49-03-01.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 31 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 **49-03-01.4.** Enforcement of act. If any an electric public utility violates or threatens to 2 violate any of the provisions of sections 49-03-01 through 49-03-01.5 or interferes with or 3 threatens to interfere with the service or system of any other electric public utility or rural 4 electric cooperative, the commission, after complaint, notice, and hearing as provided in 5 chapter 28-32, shall make its order restraining and enjoining said the electric public utility from 6 constructing or extending its interfering lines, plant, or system. In addition to the restraint 7 imposed, the commission shall prescribe such terms and conditions as it shall deem reasonable 8 and proper.

9 Provided, further, that nothing herein contained shall may be construed to prohibit or
10 limit any <u>a</u> person, who has been injured in the person's business or property by reason of a
11 violation of sections 49-03-01 through 49-03-01.5 by any <u>an</u> electric public utility <del>or electric</del>
12 cooperative corporation, from bringing an action for damages in any <u>a</u> district court of this state
13 to recover such damages.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 49-03-01.5 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

16 **49-03-01.5. Definitions.** As used in sections 49-03-01 through 49-03-01.5:

- "Electric public utility" means a privately owned supplier of electricity offering to
   supply or supplying electricity to the general public.
- "Person" includes an individual, an electric public utility, a corporation, a limited
   liability company, an association, or a rural electric cooperative.
- 3. "Rural electric cooperative" includes any electric cooperative organized under
   chapter 10-13. An electric cooperative, composed of members as prescribed by
   law, shall not be deemed to be an electric public utility.

SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 49-03-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

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### 49-03-02. Prerequisites to issuance of certificate of public convenience and

27 necessity. Before any <u>a</u> certificate may issue under this chapter, a certified copy of the articles 28 of incorporation or charter of the utility, if the applicant is a corporation, or a certified copy of the 29 articles of organization of the utility, if the applicant is a limited liability company, shall <u>must</u> be 30 filed with the commission. At the hearing of said the application upon notice as provided in this 31 title, the utility shall submit evidence showing that such the applicant has received the consent,

1 franchise, permit, ordinance, or other authority of the proper municipality or other public

2 authority, if required, or has or is about to make application therefor. The commission shall

3 have the power, after notice and hearing, to may:

4 1. Issue the certificate prayed for;

5 2. Refuse to issue such the certificate;

6 3. Issue it for the construction or operation of a portion only of the contemplated
7 facility, line, plant, system, or extension thereof; or

8 4. Issue it for the partial exercise of the right or privilege sought, conditioned upon the
9 applicant's having secured or upon the applicant's securing the consent, franchise,

10 permit, ordinance, or other authority of the proper municipality or other public

authority, and may attach to the exercise of the rights granted by any <u>a</u> certificate
 such terms and conditions as in its judgment the public convenience and necessity
 may require.

Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions, the commission may grant a certificate if no interested party<del>, including any local electric cooperative,</del> has requested a hearing on said <u>the</u> application after receiving at least twenty days' notice of opportunity to request such <u>a</u> hearing.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 49-03-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

19 **49-03-05.** Complaint upon violation of chapter. Whenever a public utility engages or 20 is about to engage in construction or operation as described in this chapter without having 21 secured a certificate of public convenience and necessity as required by the provisions of this 22 chapter, or whenever a public utility constructs or extends its line, plant, or system, or supplies, 23 or offers to supply electric service in violation of this chapter, any an interested municipality, 24 public authority, utility, electric cooperative corporation, or person, may file a complaint with the 25 commission. The commission thereupon, or upon its own motion without complaint, with or 26 without notice, may make its order requiring the public utility complained of to cease and desist 27 from such the construction or operation or other prohibited activity until the further order of the 28 commission. Upon hearing had after due notice given, the commission shall make such order 29 with respect to such the public utility and prescribe such terms and conditions as are just and 30 reasonable.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 49-20-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 49-20-12.1. Notice of change in topography of lands under or adjacent to electric 4 transmission or telecommunications lines. Before any change is made in the topography of 5 lands under, or adjacent to, any electric transmission or telecommunications lines, which 6 change would increase the hazard to travel, or to persons or property, the one proposing to 7 make such the change shall, except in the case of an emergency, at least ten days before 8 proceeding therewith, notify the public utility or cooperative corporation operating such the 9 electric transmission or telecommunications lines. Such The notification shall must clearly 10 state the nature and location of the proposed change in topography and shall must be sent to 11 such the public utility or cooperative corporation at its principal place of business within the 12 state by registered or certified mail. In case of an emergency, when ten days' notice cannot be 13 given, notice shall must be given, as herein provided, prior to before proceeding with such the

14 change.
