1	A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability
2	of adopting a statewide procedure for conducting missing persons investigations.
3	WHEREAS, missing persons generally fit into categories of runaway juveniles,
4	individuals who are missing and possibly endangered due to diminished mental capacity, and
5	persons missing under suspicious circumstances; and
6	WHEREAS, as of March 2003 the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Crime
7	Information Center reported that there were 97,297 active missing person cases in the United
8	States, which included more than 54,000 children; and
9	WHEREAS, statistics indicate that 74 percent of abducted children who are murdered
10	are dead within three hours of abduction; and
11	WHEREAS, in conducting a missing persons investigation, time is of the essence; and
12	WHEREAS, although the state of North Dakota has implemented the Amber Alert
13	System for dealing with abducted or missing children, the state does not have a statewide
14	procedure in place for conducting missing persons investigations;
15	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE
16	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
17	That the Legislative Council study the feasibility and desirability of adopting a statewide
18	procedure for conducting missing persons investigations; and
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and
20	recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
21	the Sixtieth Legislative Assembly.
