1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state treasurer;
2 and to amend and reenact section 54-11-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
3 salary of the state treasurer.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.** The amounts identified in this
6 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the state treasurer in
7 section 3 of this Act as follows:

8 Salaries and wages	\$593,830
9 Operating expenses	122,554
10 In lieu of tax payments	<u>1,910,000</u>
11 Total general fund - Base level	\$2,626,384

12 **SECTION 2. FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS OR ENHANCEMENTS INFORMATION.** The
13 amounts identified in this section represent the funding adjustments or enhancements to the
14 base funding level for the state treasurer which are included in the appropriation in section 3 of
15 this Act as follows:

16 Salaries and wages	\$38,983
17 Operating expenses	32,233
18 In lieu of tax payments	<u>(365,000)</u>
19 Total general fund - Adjustments/enhancements	(\$293,784)

20 **SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
21 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
22 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
23 other income, to the state treasurer for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency,
24 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007, as follows:

5 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-11-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **54-11-13. Salary of state treasurer.** The annual salary of the state treasurer is
8 ~~sixty two thousand nine hundred seventy four dollars through June 30, 2002, and sixty four~~
9 ~~sixty-six thousand two eight hundred thirty three two dollars through June 30, 2006, and may~~
10 not exceed sixty-nine thousand four hundred seventy-four dollars thereafter.
