- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the various divisions
- 2 under the supervision of the director of the office of management and budget; to provide for
- 3 various transfers and financial transactions; to provide an exemption from the provisions of
- 4 section 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code; to amend and reenact section 4-28-08,
- 5 subsection 6 of section 37-17.1-06, and sections 54-23.2-01, 54-52.1-06, and 57-40.6-12 of the
- 6 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state wheat commission fund, the division of
- 7 emergency management, and state radio; and to provide an appropriation to the legislative
- 8 assembly.

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9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10	SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.	The amounts identified in this
11	section represent the base level funding component appropriate	d to the office of management
12	and budget in section 3 of this Act as follows:

8	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the		
9	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
10	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
11	other income, to the office of management and budget for the purpose of defraying the		
12	expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007,		
13	as follows:

23	SECTION 4. CAPITOL BUILDING FUND. The amount of \$25,000, or so much of the		
24	sum as may be necessary, included in the estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act, is		
25	to be spent by the administration division from the capitol building fund for capitol grounds		
26	planning, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.		
27	SECTION 5. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the fiscal management		
28	division, as contained in section 1 of chapter 36 of the 2003 Session Laws is not subject to the		
29	provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation are available		
30	for continued development and operating costs of the accounting, management, and payroll		

systems, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

1 SECTION 6. STATEWIDE EQUITY POOL FOR CLASSIFIED STATE EMPLOYEES. 2 The statewide equity pool included in section 3 of this Act must be used for market equity 3 compensation adjustments for classified state employees. The market equity adjustments are 4 to begin with the month of July 2005, to be paid in August 2005. The market equity 5 adjustments are to be independent of any general salary increase provided by the fifty-ninth 6 legislative assembly. 7 The market equity increases are to be prioritized based on equity for employees whose 8 salaries are furthest from their respective salary range midpoints effective July 1, 2005. Market 9 equity increases may not be given to employees whose salary exceeds the midpoints of their 10 assigned salary range effective July 1, 2005. 11 Probationary employees are eligible for the market equity increases. Employees whose 12 documented performance levels do not meet standards are not eligible for the market equity 13 increases. 14 The human resource management services shall provide a model base plan to each 15 agency. Agencies may adopt the model plan, adopt the model plan with exceptions, or offer an 16 alternative plan which meets the intent outlined in this section. 17 Upon adoption of an appropriate plan and application to the human resource 18 management services, the fiscal management division shall transfer appropriated general fund 19 or special fund spending authority for the increases to the agencies. 20 **SECTION 7. INTENT.** Within the authority included in section 3 of this Act are the 21 following grants and special items: 22 \$53,000 Boys and girls clubwork 23 State contingencies 500,000 24 State memberships and related expenses 477,860 25 Firefighter's association 126,000 26 Unemployment insurance 1,500,000 27 Capitol grounds planning commission 25,000 28 120,000 State consultant 29 SECTION 8 TRANSFER. During the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending 30 June 30, 2007, the director of the office of management and budget is authorized to transfer

- special funds from the lands and minerals trust fund to the general fund in the amount of \$5,000,000 or such greater amount as may be available.
- **SECTION 9 FIRE AND TORNADO FUND.** The amount of \$126,000, or so much of the amount as is necessary, included in the estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act, is from the fire and tornado fund.

6 SECTION 10. BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA TRANSFERS TO STATE GENERAL

- **FUND.** During the biennium ending June 30, 2007, the industrial commission shall transfer to the state general fund up to \$60,000,000 from the current earnings and the accumulated undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota. The moneys shall be transferred in the amounts and at such times as requested by the director of the office of management and budget. Any transfer authorized may only be made to the extent the transfer does not reduce the Bank's capital structure below \$150,000,000.
- **SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-28-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 4-28-08. State wheat commission fund Continuing appropriation. Each first purchaser shall make quarterly reports and returns to the commission, on or before the twentieth day of the month next succeeding each calendar quarterly period, commencing with the calendar quarter ending September 30, 1995. The commission shall prescribe the forms to be used. With each report and return, the first purchaser shall remit to the commission, in the form of a remittance payable to the state treasurer, the tax due. The commission shall transmit all such payments to the state treasurer to be deposited in the state treasury to the credit of a special revolving fund known as the "state wheat commission fund". All money in the state wheat commission fund is appropriated on a continuing basis to the commission may be spent pursuant to legislative appropriation for carrying out the purposes of this chapter. Expenditures from the fund may be made upon vouchers duly approved by the commission to carry out this chapter. Regular audits of the commission's accounts must be conducted in accordance with chapter 54-10.
- SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Subsection 6 of section 37-17.1-06 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 6. The division of emergency management shall:

1 Coordinate the procurement and prepositioning of supplies, materials, and a. 2 equipment for disaster or emergency operations. 3 b. Provide guidance and standards for local disaster or emergency operational 4 plans. 5 Periodically review local disaster or emergency operational plans. C. 6 d. Coordinate state or state and federal assistance to local emergency 7 management organizations. 8 Establish and operate or assist local emergency management organizations e. 9 to establish and operate training programs and programs for emergency 10 public information. 11 f. Make surveys of industries, resources, and facilities, within the state, both 12 public and private, as are necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter. 13 The use of sensitive and proprietary logistical data submitted to the state in 14 confidence by individual industries and suppliers must be accorded full 15 confidentiality and will be released only in aggregate form. 16 Plan and make arrangements for the availability and use of any private g. 17 facilities, services, and property, and, if necessary and if in fact used, 18 coordinate payment for that use under terms and conditions agreed upon. 19 h. Establish access to a register of persons with types of training and skills 20 important in mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery. 21 i. Establish access to a register of equipment and facilities available for use in a 22 disaster or emergency. 23 į. Prepare, for issuance by the governor, executive orders, proclamations, and 24 quidance as necessary or appropriate in managing a disaster or emergency. 25 k. Coordinate with the federal government and any public or private agency or 26 entity in achieving any purpose of this chapter and in implementing programs 27 for disaster mitigation, preparation, response, and recovery. 28 Ι. Be the state search and rescue coordinating agency, establish access to a 29 register of search and rescue equipment and personnel in the state, and plan 30 for its effective utilization in carrying out the search for and rescue of persons 31 when no violation of criminal laws exists.

1	m. Operate a state radio broadcasting system as set out in chapter 54-23.2.		
2	n. Do other things necessary, incidental, or appropriate for the implementation of		
3	this chapter.		
4	SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 54-23.2-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
5	amended and reenacted as follows:		
6	54-23.2-01. Definitions. Wherever As used in this chapter, the word "director" is		
7	hereinafter used, it shall mean means the director of the office of management and budget		
8	division of emergency management. The word "system" hereinafter used shall mean means		
9	the state radio broadcasting system.		
10	SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 57-40.6-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
11	amended and reenacted as follows:		
12	57-40.6-12. Reports of coordination of public safety answering points coverage.		
13	The governing body of a city or county, which adopted a fee on telephone exchange access		
14	service and wireless service under this chapter, shall make an annual report of the income,		
15	expenditures, and status of its emergency services communication system. The annual report		
16	must be submitted to the state radio division and to the public safety answering points		
17	coordinating committee. The committee is composed of three members, one appointed by the		
18	North Dakota 911 association, one appointed by the North Dakota association of counties, and		
19	one appointed by the office of management and budget adjutant general to represent the state		
20	radio division. The public safety answering points coordinating committee shall file its report		
21	ith the legislative council by November first of each even-numbered year.		
22	SECTION 15. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the		
23	neral fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$100,000, or so much		
24	the sum as may be necessary, to the legislative assembly for designing and remodeling the		
25	oak room and bill room and as part of the remodeling project make a new committee hearing		
26	oom, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.
