1	A concurrent resolution urging all educators to ensure that the schoolchildren of North Dakota
2	are taught the history of the United States flag, that they are taught to respect the flag, to
3	exercise proper flag etiquette, and to understand that the flag is the most visible and enduring
4	symbol of the American spirit.
5	WHEREAS, the United States flag is unique in the deep and noble significance of its
6	message to the entire world, a message of national independence, of individual liberty, of
7	idealism, and of patriotism; and
8	WHEREAS, the United States flag incarnates for all mankind the spirit of liberty and the
9	glorious ideal of human freedom; and
10	WHEREAS, the United States flag symbolizes equal opportunity for life, liberty, and the
11	pursuit of happiness and is safeguarded by the principles of duty, righteousness, and justice;

13	WHEREAS, the United States flag embodies the essence of patriotism and the strength
14	of the American nation; and
15	WHEREAS, on June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress passed an Act to establish an
16	official flag for our new nation; and
17	WHEREAS, for more than 200 years, the United States flag has been the symbol of our
18	nation's unity, as well as a source of pride and inspiration for millions of citizens;
19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE
20	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
21	That the Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly urges all educators to ensure that the
22	schoolchildren of North Dakota are taught the history of the United States flag, that they are
23	taught to respect the flag, to exercise proper flag etiquette, and to understand that the flag is the
24	most visible and enduring symbol of the American spirit; and
