FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2079

- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-10-18.3 and 15-10-18.5 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to free higher education tuition and fees for dependents of
- 3 veterans and survivors of firefighters, emergency medical services personnel, and peace
- 4 officers.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-18.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 15-10-18.3. Free tuition in North Dakota institutions of higher education. Any
- 9 dependent, as defined in section 15-10-18.2 upon being duly accepted for enrollment into any
- 10 <u>undergraduate degree or certificate program of a</u> North Dakota state supported <u>state</u> institution
- 11 of higher education or state supported career and technical education school, must be allowed
- 12 to obtain a bachelor's degree or certificate of completion, for so long as the dependent is
- 13 eligible, free of any tuition and fee charges, except those charged to retire outstanding bonds;
- 14 provided, however, that the bachelor's degree or certificate of completion is earned within a
- 15 thirty-six-month forty-five-month or eight-semester ten-semester period or its equivalent; and
- 16 further provided that tuition and fee charges shall not include costs for aviation flight charges or
- expenses. Once a person qualifies as a dependent under sections 15-10-18.2 and 15-10-18.3,
- 18 there shall be no removal the dependent may not be disqualified from the benefits of this
- 19 section due to such an occurrence as the return of the prisoner of war or person missing in
- 20 action.
- 21 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-10-18.5 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 22 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 23 **15-10-18.5.** Free tuition in North Dakota institutions of higher education for survivor of firefighter, emergency medical services personnel, or peace officer. Should If

- a firefighter, an emergency medical services personnel as defined under section 23-27-04.3, or
- 2 <u>a peace officer die dies</u> as a direct result of injuries received while engaged in the performance
- 3 of official duties under circumstances dangerous to human life, the survivor, upon being duly
- 4 accepted for enrollment into any undergraduate degree or certificate program of a North
- 5 Dakota state-supported state institution of higher education or state-supported career and
- 6 technical education school, must be allowed to obtain a bachelor's degree or certificate of
- 7 completion, for so long as the dependent is eligible, free of any tuition and fee charges, except
- 8 those charged to retire outstanding bonds; provided, however, that the bachelor's degree or
- 9 certificate of completion is earned within a thirty-six-month forty-five-month or eight-semester
- 10 <u>ten-semester</u> period or its equivalent; and further provided that tuition and fee charges may not
- 11 include costs for aviation flight charges or expenses.
