Patricia: They are limited while under disciplinary action. In section 43-1. An unlicensed person is anyone who assists in the practice of nursing under the direction of a nurse.

Chairman Price: Currently for a LPN coming in from another state, what are the requirements for them to meet?

Mr. Benson: An LPN coming in from another state to ND has to have the education that the State requires. If an RN fails the exams, she cannot be an LPN. You must have the appropriate education for the appropriate license. Two states allow that but ND does not.

Minutes:

Chairman Senator J. Lee opened the hearing on HB 1118 relating to the issuance of limited licenses and registrations by the board of nursing and the requirements of nurse applicants for license by endorsement.

Connie Kalanek (ND Board of Nursing) testified in support of HB 1118 and explained the bill. (See attachment #1)

Senator Warner said it seemed odd to have the same process in place for disciplinary action as for someone who is making a good faith effort but not at quite the same standards. He asked why they would use the same process for both sides.

Ms. Kalanek said she wouldn't envision it's the same process. If someone is under disciplinary action and their license is encumbered, their license would be marked encumbered and they would have some limitations or restrictions in practice. This individual would receive an unrestricted license but it would be limited to their current location. If that individual chose to go to another employer they would have to take a refresher course.

Senator Warner asked Ms. Kalanek to outline some of the disciplinary causes that would cause an encumbered license.

Hearing Date: 2-21-07

Ms. Kalanek replied that an encumbered license example that came to mind was medication administration. There may be monitoring or limitations on the medication administration.

Another example would be limitations on hours they can practice. They could have more than one limitation.

Senator Dever asked if the House made extensive amendments.

Ms. Kalanek said there was just one word that was changed. On page 3, sub 5, line 28, "that" was changed to "another".

Senator J. Lee said that reading along with the testimony it talks about page 6. The bill only goes to page 5.

Ms. Kalanek replied that it should be page 5, line 3.

Senator Dever asked if the rules are in place now or if they will be establishing rules.

Ms. Kalanek said they would do a rule promulgation.

Senator J. Lee said the person who contacted her would still have several months to wait until the rules process is finished before she would be able to be licensed.

Ms. Kalanek said the law would go into effect August 1. That would probably be left to the discretion of the board. She thought if that person appeared before the board they could grant her that application.

There was no opposing or neutral testimony.

The hearing on HB 1118 was closed.

Senator Erbele asked if an emergency clause would be helpful.

Ms. Kalanek said that would move the process along faster.

Senator Erbele moved to amend HB 1118 by adding an emergency clause.

Senator Warner seconded the motion.

Roll call vote 6-0-0. Amendment accepted.

Chairman Price and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide information regarding the HB 1118 related to limited licenses and registrations and requirements for license by endorsement. The Board currently licenses approximately: RNs 9000; LPN 3500; APRN 700; UAPs 2300; Medication Assistants 1400. Dr. Kalanek, Executive Director of the BON is unable to be here today. Two staff members are available for questions if needed-Julie Schwan and Patricia Hill.

Section 1. Amendment. Subsection f. The proposed addition of the term "registration" which includes the unlicensed assistive person, would grant authority for the Board to limit the practice of the unlicensed assistive person. The Board has used this authority in the past to limit the licenses for nurses sanctioned for violations of the Nurse Practices Act and needed restrictions placed on their license. It has also been used as non disciplinary to limit the practice of nurses who are unable to practice within the full scope of practice. This would expand the authority for the Board to limit the scope to include the unlicensed assistive person.

<u>Section 2. Amendment.</u> The proposed addition of the unlicensed assistive person provides consistency in the Nurse Practices Act (with the proposed change in Section 1).

<u>Page 6</u>: Subsection 3- confirms the authority of the board to issue a limited license or registration for good cause.

The Board has been approached by several nurses who are retired or semi-retired and who would like to maintain licensure but would not meet all the renewal requirements. The limited license for "good cause" is intended to restrict practice to the current scope of practice and to the current location of employment or volunteer setting. This licensee would not receive a compact license but rather a single state license.

 Provision to grant the Board the authority to issue limited licenses to nurses and registrations to Unlicensed Assistive Persons who do not meet the full licensure requirements. The provision in the law would continue to be used for disciplinary action restriction as well as in non disciplinary situations.

- Retired or semi-retired nurses who maintain a minimum number of hours of practice could qualify for licensure.
- Restrict practice to current scope of practice.
- May remain licensed while performing volunteer nursing care.
- Licensee would receive a single state license not a compact license.
- Rules will be promulgated to define the process.

I have attached two letters- one from a licensee and the other from her son asking the Board for consideration regarding not meeting the licensure requirements.

Section 2. Amendment. Subsection b(5). Also, included in the above legislation is a proposed provision to be added to the Nurse Practices Act for endorsement requirements. This provision is to allow licensure by endorsement of LPNs who did not complete an LPN program but rather graduated from an RN program and were not successful on the NCLEX ® RN examination. The Board has been approached by several applicants who have been licensed as an LPN in another state for several years but did not graduate from a LPN program. This legislation requires that the applicant must have practiced with an unencumbered license in another state for at least 24 months prior to application. Also, this licensee would not receive a compact license but rather a single state license.

- Provision to allow licensure by endorsement of LPNs who did not complete an LPN program.
- Must have graduated from an RN Program.
- Must have practiced with an unencumbered license in another state for at least 24 months prior to application.
- Licensee would receive a single state license.
- Rules may be promulgated to define the process.

The Board would respectfully request a change in the language on page 5, line 1- change "that" to "another". So it would read ...nurse in that another state.... This would provide for a nurse initially licensed in SD but working in MN to meet the requirements of this provision.
