Minutes:

Senator David O'Connell, District 6, introduced the bill. (Testimony Attached.) He outlined the changes from the present law. It allows student who are residents of North Dakota who graduate from South Dakota schools to be eligible for all scholarships and loans offered to North Dakota high school graduates.

Tom Decker, DPI, testified in favor of the bill. (Testimony Attached.) This bill corrects an unintended consequence in the cross border attendance bill passed in the last session and would make ND students graduating from SD schools eligible for ND scholarships.

This came to light when one of those students called a ND higher education institution to apply for a scholarship and was told that he was not eligible.

Representative Mueller: What about those South Dakota students who have graduated from ND schools, are they eligible for ND scholarships?

Decker: No. South Dakota is working with a similar piece of legislation to correct the same problem.

Frank Tomack, parent, testified in favor of the bill. He discussed the ramifications the present law had on his senior student. He wished to apply for a Regent Scholar. He was told he was not eligible and that's when I contacted Tom Decker. I recommend a do pass on this bill.

Jim Gross, superintendent for Selfridge, testified in favor of the bill. We have students all over the state that go across the border all along the border. This needs to be corrected to be fair to all.

Doug Johnson, ND Council of Education Leaders, testified in favor of the bill. I think it is important to correct the error that was made. It would be appropriate for this committee to pass this bill.

Chairman Freborg, members of the committee, for the record, I am Tom Decker, Director, School Finance & Organization, Department of Public Instruction.

House Bill 1235 corrects an unintended consequence of passage of the North Dakota, South Dakota cross border attendance provisions last session.

While that bill has generally been working exactly as we expected it to work, it creates a circumstance in which some North Dakota students who happen to graduate from a South Dakota high school are ineligible for certain North Dakota scholarships.

House Bill 1235 amends provisions of law to indicate that North Dakota student's who attend a South Dakota high school and graduate from a South Dakota high school, are eligible for these scholarships.

It is interesting to note that South Dakota is working on an identical piece of legislation to ensure that their students attending North Dakota high schools and graduating from North Dakota high schools are eligible for their state scholarships.

We recommend a do pass on House Bill 1235.
