Minutes:

Chairman Herbel opened the hearing on HB 1302.

Representative Hawken: This bill is being submitted at the request of one of my constituents.

He is an apartment owner and thinks that older people should be able to have pets, but he feels very strongly that he needs to have a pet deposit that is reasonable so that if there is a problem he can recoup his losses. I also have an amendment. The apartment people were going to put in their own bill, but after they saw this they asked if we would amend it slightly and there would only be one bill. At the bottom where change would have been may not exceed two months rent, the proposed amendment I have for you would be the great of \$2,500 or two months rent. We are raising the amount of the deposit for pets.

Rep. Kim Koppelman Representative Hawken's do you have any objection to clarifying the language on two months rent?

Rep. Hawken: They really did not want to do that for the simple reason that they do not want to come back. The two months rent would float and it certainly different in every different in every single town.

Rep. Kim Koppelman: I am not saying remove the dollar amount, I am saying when you make a statement to read an amount the greater of \$2,500 or two months rent. Worried about

deposit being two months rent so then when I leave I don't have to pay my last two months rent.

Rep. Hawken: This only refers to pet deposits. I cleared this through allot of people in different parts of the state and this was their preferred language so I can not see that that would make a difference.

Rep. Louis Pinkerton: For my clarification your amendment would make it greater of either the \$2500 or two months rent. So the pet deposit would have to be \$2500. Many people are using the building rental to have your pet there as a drawing card. They say we want an extra \$400 so that would have to be \$2500 or 2 months rent.

Rep. Hawken: It is not mandated they charge this. That is the maximum. They can certainly be anywhere under this. This is probably more for condo rentals than apartment rentals. A problem has come up in a number of our communities.

Rep. Louis Pinkerton: This is increasing the maximum charge?

Rep. Hawken: Yes

Rep. Steve Zaiser: Do you think this might cause people to go to the maximum.

Rep. Hawken: I would doubt it. Apartment rental in many communities is a little scary so I don't believe that would happen. This lets people have pets and protect their property.

Rep. Donald Dietrich: How does a service animal come into play?

Rep. Hawken: Are you referring to a dog for the blind? They are exempt. There is nothing regarding that. I am sure people can work that out. I am sure the landlord would be able to work that out.

Chairman Herbel: I think you had indicated that rental is getting to be tough competition so they will be some what prudent about what they do.

Rep. Hawken: I honestly don't think this bill will affect too many rentals. There are those that can truly are some where the landlord does care about pets being there, but he also has to take care of his business side.

Rocky Gordon: ND Apartment Association: Service animals are not considered pets and so this would have no affect on service animals. There was a little bit of concern about the ceiling here, does that mean it is going to be \$2500. I can assure that is not the case. When we real with security deposits outside of pet situations, ND allows for an amount up to one months rent. That is extremely rare that that is charged. It is typically more like half. In the Bismarck in the past few years we have seen allot of \$99 more in specials. I don't think raising the ceiling to \$2500 is going to change that. A number of years ago the apartment association put this bill in response to residence requesting the ability to have pets and we were limited before to one months rent. It is not financially feasible to go to court to get your expenses back. Over the years inflation has caused the price to raise to \$2500. We are encouraging landlords to open up apartments to as many pet owners and can, but they will get compensated for any damages.

Rep. Nancy Johnson: Definition of a pet? Pet means any domesticated animal.

No opposition.

Representative Kathy Hawkin, Dist. 46 - In Favor

Explained of constituent rental properties and want to raise the amount of pet allowance on the property to \$2500 Max or 2 months rent. Service dogs are not included.

S Heitkamp: \$2500 or 2 months rent, whichever is greater?

K Hawkin: Yes.

S Klein: \$2500 or 2 mos. Rent. It was \$1500, raised \$1000 for carpet and paint.

S Potter: What if someone cheated and snuck a cat in? Does this change anything?

K Hawkin: That would have to be determined. That's probably a lawsuit. This is an upfront cost.

S Heitkamp: This doesn't stop me if I have a piece of property from charging a lesser deposit, if I want to compete for the pet owners.

K Hawkin: No it does not. This is a maximum.

Rocky Gordon - Lobbyist ND - In Favor

This is an updating to pass on increased costs. This bill opens the market for people with pets.

S Klein: Do they realize that with a pet they'll need to have a bigger deposit?

R Gordon: They're aware of it. Not just because of the money, but we want to open market for people with pets so they could be responsible for what damages pets might do.

S Klein: So you weren't renting to pet owners?

R Gordon: That's correct. In a \$500 a month apartment, we could charge \$500 as a security deposit and landlords weren't willing to take the risk, so by doing this we've opened up the market a little more.
