- 4 other individuals.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 5-01-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 5-01-08. Persons <u>Individuals</u> under twenty-one years of age prohibited from using alcoholic beverages or entering licensed premises Penalty.
 - 1. Except as permitted in this section and section 5-02-06, a person an individual under twenty-one years of age may not manufacture or attempt to manufacture, purchase or attempt to purchase, consume or have recently consumed other than during a religious service, be under the influence of, be in possession of, or furnish money to any person individual for the purchase of an alcoholic beverage.
 - 2. A person An individual under twenty-one years of age may not enter any licensed premises where alcoholic beverages are being sold or displayed, except:
 - a. A restaurant if accompanied by a parent or legal guardian;
- b. In accordance with section 5-02-06;
 - If the person individual is an independent contractor or the independent contractor's employee engaged in contract work and is not engaged in selling, dispensing, delivering, or consuming alcoholic beverages;
 - d. If the person individual is a law enforcement officer or other public official who enters the premises in the performance of official duty; or

1 If the person individual enters the premises for training, education, or e. 2 research purposes under the supervision of a person an individual twenty-one 3 or more years of age with prior notification of the local licensing authority. 4 3. A violation of this section is a class B misdemeanor. 5 4. The court, under this section, may refer the person individual to an outpatient 6 addiction facility licensed by the department of human services for evaluation and 7 appropriate counseling or treatment. 8 5. The offense of consumption occurs in the county of consumption or the county 9 where the offender is arrested. 10 6. For purposes of this section, a person an individual is not twenty-one years of age 11 until eight a.m. on that person's individual's twenty-first birthday. 12 <u>7.</u> An individual under twenty-one years of age is immune from criminal prosecution 13 under this section if that individual called 911 and reported that another individual 14 under twenty-one years of age was in need of medical assistance due to alcohol consumption or provided assistance to the individual in need of medical assistance 15 16 until assistance arrived and remained on the scene and cooperated with medical 17 assistance and law enforcement personnel on the scene. The maximum number of 18 individuals that may be immune for any one occurrence is five individuals. 19 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 5-01-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is 20 amended and reenacted as follows: 21 5-01-09. Delivery to certain persons unlawful. 22 Any person individual knowingly delivering alcoholic beverages to a person an 23 individual under twenty-one years of age, except as allowed under section 5-02-06, 24 or to a habitual drunkard, an incompetent, or an obviously intoxicated person 25 individual is guilty of a class A misdemeanor, subject to sections 5-01-08, 26 5-01-08.1, and 5-01-08.2. 27 <u>2.</u> An individual under twenty-one years of age is immune from criminal prosecution 28 under this section if that individual called 911 and reported that another individual 29 under twenty-one years of age was in need of medical assistance due to alcohol

AMENDMENT. Section 5-02-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 5-02-06. Prohibitions for persons individuals under twenty-one years of age -Penalty - Exceptions. 15 16 Except as permitted in this section, a licensee who dispenses alcoholic beverages 17 to a person an individual under twenty-one years of age, or who permits a person 18 an individual under twenty-one years of age to remain on the licensed premises 19 while alcoholic beverages are being sold or displayed, is guilty of a class A 20 misdemeanor, subject to sections 5-01-08, 5-01-08.1, and 5-01-08.2. 21 2. A person An individual under twenty-one years of age may not remain in a 22 restaurant where alcoholic beverages are being sold except if the restaurant is 23 separated from the room in which alcoholic beverages are opened or mixed and 24 gross sales of food are at least equal to gross sales of alcoholic beverages which 25 are consumed in the dining area, or if the person individual is employed by the 26 restaurant as a food waiter, food waitress, busboy, or busgirl under the direct 27 supervision of a person an individual twenty-one or more years of age and is not 28 engaged in the sale, dispensing, delivery, or consumption of alcoholic beverages. 29 3. A person An individual under twenty-one years of age may enter and remain on

A person An individual who is nineteen years of age or older but under twenty-one 11 years of age may be employed by a restaurant as provided in subsection 2 to 12 serve and collect money for alcoholic beverages, if the person individual is under 13 the direct supervision of a person an individual twenty-one or more years of age, 14 but may not be engaged in mixing, dispensing, or consuming alcoholic beverages. 15 Any establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold may employ persons 16 individuals from eighteen to twenty-one years of age to work in the capacity of 17 musicians under the direct supervision of a person an individual twenty-one or 18 more years of age. 19 For purposes of this section, a person an individual is not twenty-one years of age 6. 20 until eight a.m. on that person's individual's twenty-first birthday. 21 If an individual is convicted of this section, the court shall consider the following in 7. 22 mitigation: 23 After consuming the alcohol, the underage individual was in need of medical 24 assistance as a result of consuming alcohol; and 25 Within twelve hours after the underage individual consumed the alcohol, the b. 26 defendant contacted the police or emergency medical personnel to report that 27 the underage individual was in need of medical assistance as a result of 28 consuming alcohol. 29 SECTION 4. Unlawful to encourage or contribute to the deprivation or delinquency 2 of minor - Penalty. 3 Any person individual who by any act willfully encourages, causes, or contributes 1. 4 to the delinquency or deprivation of any minor is guilty of a class A misdemeanor. 5 2. Any person individual who by any act willfully encourages, causes, or contributes 6 to the deprivation of a child less than sixteen years of age by causing that child to 7 engage in sexual conduct as defined under section 12.1-27.2-01, in any play, 8 motion picture, photograph, dance, or other visual representation is guilty of a 9 class C felony. 10 If an individual is convicted of this section for encouraging, causing, or contributing <u>3.</u> 11 to the consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages by an individual under 12 twenty-one years of age, the court shall consider the following in mitigation: 13 After consuming the alcohol, the underage individual was in need of medical <u>a.</u> 14 assistance as a result of consuming alcohol; and 15 Within twelve hours after the underage individual consumed the alcohol, the b. 16 defendant contacted the police or emergency medical personnel to report that 17 the underage individual was in need of medical assistance as a result of 18 consuming alcohol.
