## HOUSE BILL NO. 1320

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact four new sections to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the establishment of a prekindergarten program; to amend and
- 3 reenact section 15.1-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the approval of early
- 4 childhood education programs; and to provide an appropriation.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 15.1-37-01. Early childhood education program Approval.
- Any person or school district operating an early childhood education program may request approval of the program from the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent shall approve an early childhood education program if the program:
- - 2. b. Follows a developmentally appropriate curriculum; and
- 15 <u>3. c.</u> Is in compliance with all municipal and state health, fire, and safety requirements.
- Per student funding will not be provided to individuals or school districts offering a prekindergarten program.
  - For purposes of this section, "early childhood education program" includes a
     prekindergarten program established under section 2 of this Act.
- 21 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 created and enacted as follows:
- 23 <u>Prekindergarten program Authority.</u> The board of a school district may establish a 24 prekindergarten program. The program must be available to students who are at least four

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- 1 years old by midnight, August thirty-first of the year of enrollment, but who are not enrolled in a
- 2 <u>public school kindergarten program.</u> The enrollment of a student in a prekindergarten program
- 3 <u>is voluntary</u>. A prekindergarten program may also be established through an educational
- 4 <u>association governed by a joint powers agreement.</u>
- 5 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows:
  - <u>Prekindergarten program Facilities.</u> A prekindergarten program established under section 2 of this Act may be located in a public school building, if space is available, or in any other setting that meets all local and state health, fire, and safety laws.
- SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
  - Prekindergarten program Financial support. The board of a school district may receive and expend any state or federal funds specifically appropriated for the support of a prekindergarten program and any gifts, grants, and donations for that purpose. The board may not use any state funds appropriated for students in kindergarten, in grades one through twelve, or in early childhood special education programs, to support a prekindergarten program.
  - **SECTION 5.** A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
  - <u>Prekindergarten program Requirements.</u> In order to receive any state funding for a prekindergarten program established under section 2 of this Act, a district shall:
  - 1. Use an application process for the admission of students to the program;
- - Limit the size of each prekindergarten class to twenty students;
  - 4. Ensure that the adult-to-child ratio in each class does not exceed one to ten;
- Admit only those students whose parents permit the collection and dissemination
   of data regarding the cognitive, physical, and social development of the student;
   and
- 7. Meet the criteria for program approval established in section 15.1-37-01.

<b>SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION.</b> There is appropriated out of any moneys in the
general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$500,000, or so much
of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of
providing grants to school districts offering prekindergarten programs for the biennium
beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. The superintendent of public instruction
shall distribute \$450,000 in grants according to the number of students each school district has
in approved prekindergarten programs. The grant payment per student may not exceed fifty
percent of the per student payment established for students in grades one through twelve. The
superintendent may prorate the per student payment if the appropriation in this section is
insufficient. The superintendent may use \$50,000 of the amount appropriated by this section to
cover administrative fees and monitoring expenses incurred as a result of the program.
