- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-29-13 and 15.1-31-03 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to tuition payments for nonresident students and students
- 3 participating in open enrollment.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-29-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-29-13. Tuition payments - Nonresident students.

- a. Except as provided in this subsection, the <u>The</u> board of a school district that admits a nonresident student shall charge and collect tuition for the student.

 Either the student's district of residence shall pay the tuition to the admitting district in accordance with section 15.1-29-12 or the student's parent shall pay the tuition to the admitting district in accordance with section 15.1-29-07.
 - A board may shall charge tuition for nonresident students enrolled in an approved alternative education program.
 - e. Except as otherwise provided, if If a school district fails to charge and collect tuition for a nonresident student, the districts shall forfeit any state aid otherwise payable for the nonresident student.
- 2. a. The board of a school district may admit a nonresident student from another district in this state offering the same grade level as that in which the student is enrolled without a charge and collection of tuition if the sending and admitting districts have entered into a written contract regarding the student's admission.
 - b. For purposes of determining whether the same grade level is offered, two or more school districts cooperating with each other for the joint provision of

2			instruction must be considered to be a single district.
3		e .	The contract must specify whether transportation is to be provided and, if so,
4			by which district. If a school district of residence does not provide
5			transportation to the student, it may be provided by the admitting district and
6			the admitting district is then entitled to state payments for the transportation of
7			the student.
8		d.	A contract is not necessary if the nonresident student is enrolled in an
9			approved alternative education program for which no tuition is charged.
10		e .	A school district may admit a nonresident student described in section
11			15.1-31-07 from another school district in this state without a charge and
12			collection of tuition and without a written agreement.
13	3.	A school district may not charge or collect from a nonresident student, the	
14		stuc	lent's parent, or the student's district of residence any fees or charges not
15		othe	erwise assessed to all resident students.
16	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-31-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
17	amended and reenacted as follows:		
18	15.1-31-03. Open enrollment - Per student aid - Tuition apportionment - Cost of		
19	education.		
20	1.	Onc	e a student is enrolled in an admitting district, the student must remain enrolled
21		in th	ne admitting district until:
22		a.	The student graduates;
23		b.	The student relocates to another district;
24		c.	The student's parent applies for enrollment in another school district; or
25		d.	The student's parent notifies the student's school district of residence that the
26			student will attend school in the school district of residence the following year.
27	2.	Pay	ment for per student aid must be made to the admitting district in accordance
28		with	chapter 15.1-27.
29	3.	For	purposes of A student's school district of residence shall pay tuition to the
30		scho	ool district in which the student is open-enrolled as determined under chapter
31		<u>15.1</u>	<u>-29.</u>

- 4. The superintendent of public instruction shall forward tuition apportionment
 payments, a student whose application is approved under this section is
 considered a resident of the admitting district.
 - 4. Except as specifically provided in this chapter, chapter 15.1-29 does not apply to students involved in open enrollment on behalf of a student who is open-enrolled to the district in which the student is open-enrolled.
