- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 23-27-01, 23-27-02, 23-27-03, and 23-27-04,
- 2 subsections 2 and 3 of section 23-27-04.1, and sections 23-27-04.2 and 23-27-04.4 of the
- 3 North Dakota Century Code, relating to regulation of emergency medical services operations
- 4 and emergency medical services personnel.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-27-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 23-27-01. <u>License required -</u> Licensing of emergency medical services operations
 9 Exception Waiver.
- The state department of health shall license emergency medical services
 operations. After June 30, 2001, the department shall limit the issuance of a
 license for any new emergency medical services operation based on the needs of
 the service area if the applicant for the new license was licensed before July 1,
 2001, and was subsequently relicensed under section 23-27-04.5. <u>A license for an</u>
 emergency medical services operation is nontransferable.
- Emergency medical services may not be advertised, offered, or provided to the
 public unless the except by an emergency medical services operator of the
- 18 services is licensed as an emergency medical services operation by the
- 19 department that provides the emergency medical services through emergency
- 20 <u>medical services personnel</u>. <u>A license for an operator of an emergency medical</u>
 21 <u>services operation is nontransferable and the</u>
- Except as otherwise provided under subsection 4, an emergency medical services
 operator must be separately licensed for each operation that operator operates.
 Each of the operator's emergency medical services operations and an operation

1		that is headquartered from a separate location must be considered a separate			
2		operation ; however, . Under this subsection, an operation with a single			
3		headquarters site may dispatch vehicles and <u>emergency medical services</u>			
4		personnel from more than one location if calls requesting services are received			
5		and orders for vehicle dispatch are made at the single headquarters site.

6	<u>4.</u>	Notwithstanding subsection 3, an operator of an emergency medical services			
7		operation may operate one or more substation ambulance services operations			
8		under a single license if:			
9		a. The headquarters ambulance services operation is not a substation			
10		ambulance services operation of another emergency medical services			
11		operation;			
12		b. The substation ambulance services operation area borders the headquarters			
13		ambulance services operation area or borders another substation of the			
14		headquarters ambulance service operation;			
15		c. The headquarters ambulance services operation and the substation			
16		ambulance services operation are dispatched by the same entity; and			
17		d. The operator of the emergency medical services operation pays a license fee			
18		for each of its substation ambulance services operations.			
19	3. <u>5.</u>	The provisions of this chapter do not apply to an operator from another state who			
20		which is headquartered at a location outside of this state and transports patients			
21		across state lines, but the operator may not treat patients within this state or pick			
22		up patients within this state for transportation to locations within this state, except			
23		as provided by rule.			
24	4. <u>6.</u>	The state health council shall adopt rules for special licenses and waiver			
25		provisions for an operator of an emergency medical services operation intended			
26		for industrial sites not available to the general public.

1	<u>2.</u>	"Emergency medical services" means the prehospital medical stabilization or and			
2		transportation of persons individuals who are sick, injured, wounded, or otherwise			
3		incapacitated or helpless by any person who holds out to the public as being in			
4		that service or who regularly provides that service emergency medical services			
5		personnel with physician oversight. The term includes assessing, stabilizing, and			
6		treating life-threatening and non-life-threatening medical conditions.			
7	<u>3.</u>	"Emergency medical services operation" means an entity licensed to offer and			
8		provide emergency medical services by emergency medical services personnel			
9		with physician oversight. The term includes basic life support ambulance services,			
10		advanced life support ambulance services, air ambulance services, and			
11		quick-response unit services.			
12	<u>4.</u>	"Emergency medical services personnel" means individuals who provide			
13		emergency medical services for emergency medical services operations. The			
14		term includes emergency medical services professionals, drivers, and			
15		department-certified emergency medical services providers, such as			
16		cardiopulmonary resuscitation drivers and first responders.			
17	<u>5.</u>	"Emergency medical services professional" means an individual licensed by the			
18		department as an emergency medical technician-basic, emergency medical			
19		technician-intermediate, or emergency medical technician-paramedic.			
20	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
21	amended and reenacted as follows:				
22	23-27-03. License fees. The fee for a an emergency medical services operation				
23	license to operate an emergency medical services operation and perform emergency medical				
24	services or a substation ambulance services operation must be set by the state health council				
25	at a sum of not more than twenty-five dollars annually, as may be required to defray the costs				
26	of administration of the licensing program. Individuals providing This operation license fee				
27	does not apply to licensure or certification of emergency medical services may not be assessed				
28	this license fee personnel. All license fees must be paid to the state department of health and				
29	deposited with the state treasurer and credited to the state general fund.				
30	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
31	amended and reenacted as follows:

20		that	include direct medical control to refuse transport of an individual.			
21	SEC		N 5. AMENDMENT. Subsections 2 and 3 of section 23-27-04.1 of the North			
22	Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:					
23	2.	For	the purpose of this section, "volunteer" means an individual who receives no			
24		com	pensation or who is paid expenses, reasonable benefits, nominal fees, or a			
25		com	bination of expenses, reasonable benefits, and nominal fees to perform the			
26		serv	rices for which the individual volunteered, provided that the fees do not exceed			
27		twer	nty four hundred ten thousand dollars in any calendar year.			
28	3.	For	a volunteer physician providing medical direction overview to an emergency			
29		med	lical services operation and the operation's personnel, the twenty four hundred			
30		ten t	thousand dollar maximum fees amount is calculated separately for each			
31		eme	ergency medical services operation for which the physician volunteered medical			

- direction overview. This section does not relieve a person from liability for
 damages resulting from the intoxication, willful misconduct, or gross negligence of
 the person rendering the emergency care or services.
- SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-04.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **23-27-04.2.** Emergency medical services - State assistance. The state department 7 of health shall assist in the training of emergency medical services personnel of certain 8 emergency medical services operations as determined by the department and financially shall 9 assist certain emergency medical services operations as determined by the department in 10 obtaining equipment. Assistance provided under this section must be within the limits of 11 legislative appropriation. The department shall adopt criteria for eligibility for assistance in the 12 training of <u>emergency medical services</u> personnel of various types of emergency medical 13 services operations. To qualify for financial assistance for equipment an emergency medical 14 services operation shall certify, in the manner required by the department, that the operation 15 has fifty percent of the amount of funds necessary for identified equipment acquisitions. The 16 department shall adopt a schedule of eligibility for financial assistance for equipment. The 17 schedule must provide for a direct relationship between the amount of funds certified and the 18 number of responses during the preceding calendar year for the purpose of rendering medical 19 care, transportation, or both, to individuals who were sick or incapacitated. The schedule must 20 require that as the number of responses increases, a greater amount of funds certified is 21 required. The schedule must classify responses and the financial assistance available for 22 various classifications. The department may establish minimum and maximum amounts of 23 financial assistance to be provided to an emergency medical services operation under this 24 section. If applications for financial assistance exceed the amount of allocated and available 25 funds, the department may prorate the funds among the applicants in accordance with criteria 26 adopted by the department. No more than one-half of the funds appropriated by the legislative 27 assembly each biennium and allocated for training assistance may be distributed in the first 28 year of the biennium.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-04.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 23-27-04.4. Supervision of certified or licensed emergency service medical

- 2 technician hospital personnel. Certified or licensed emergency medical
- 3 technicians-intermediate and paramedics, who are employed by a hospital and who are
- 4 working in a nonemergency setting <u>may provide patient care within a scope of practice</u>
- 5 established by the department. Under this section, these emergency medical services
- 6 professionals are under the supervision of the hospital's patient services management nurse
- 7 <u>executive</u>.
