- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to coordinators of English language learner services; and to provide
- 3 appropriations.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6 created and enacted as follows:

7 English language learner services - Coordinator. Each educational association

8 governed by a joint powers agreement, which the superintendent of public instruction has

9 verified as meeting the requirements of section 15.1-07-28, shall contract with an individual to

- 10 serve as a coordinator of English language learner services for member school districts. The
- 11 individual shall:
- 12 <u>1.</u> <u>Provide consultation;</u>
- 13 <u>2.</u> <u>Provide assessment services;</u>
- 14 <u>3.</u> <u>Collect and report data;</u>
- 15 <u>4.</u> Provide or coordinate professional development opportunities;

16 <u>5.</u> <u>Provide or coordinate parental training opportunities; and</u>

17 <u>6.</u> <u>Provide or coordinate the provision of direct student services, if requested.</u>

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$900,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of providing each educational association with \$100,000 to meet the costs of contracting with a coordinator of English language learner services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

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1 **SECTION 3.** APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 2 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$50,000, or so much 3 of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of 4 providing professional development grants to eligible institutions of higher education, for the 5 biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. An "eligible institution" is an 6 institution of higher education that is under the control of the state board of higher education 7 and which offers an approved English language learner teacher education program. The grants 8 must be used to reimburse the institutions for any costs incurred in the provision of professional 9 development opportunities for teachers of English language learners.
