## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1407

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 40-49 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to referral of an ordinance adopted by a board of park commissioners.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 40-49 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## Petition to refer ordinance - Suspension of ordinance - Publication - Ballot.

- An ordinance that has been adopted by the board of park commissioners may be referred to the qualified electors of the park district by a petition protesting the ordinance. The petition must be signed by qualified electors of the park district equal to at least ten percent of the entire vote cast for all candidates for executive officer of the city at the preceding regular city election and must be presented to the board of park commissioners within ten days and before four p.m. on the tenth day after the ordinance described in the petition became effective. Unless the ordinance protested against was passed by at least a two-thirds vote of the members of the board of park commissioners for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety and contains a statement of its urgency, an ordinance protested against is suspended upon the filling of a petition. A petition filed under this section must meet the requirements of sections 40-12-03 and 40-12-04 and the city auditor shall examine and certify the petition as provided in section 40-12-05.
- When a referendum petition is filed, the board of park commissioners shall reconsider the ordinance described in the petition, and if the ordinance is not entirely repealed, the board shall submit the ordinance to the vote of the qualified electors of the park district at the next regular city election or at a special election

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1		to be called for that purpose. The ordinance may not become effective unless a
2		majority of the qualified electors voting on the question vote in favor of the
3		ordinance. If the referred ordinance was not suspended by the filing of the
4		referendum petition, the ordinance becomes void if the ordinance is disapproved
5		by a majority vote of the qualified electors voting on the question.
6	<u>3.</u>	The city auditor shall publish an ordinance to be submitted to the electors under
7		this section once in the official newspaper of the city. The publication must be
8		made no more than twenty days nor fewer than five days before the submission of
9		the ordinance to a vote.
10	<u>4.</u>	The ballot to be used in voting upon a referred ordinance must be in substantially
11		the following form:
