- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 32-12.2 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to indemnification and insurance provisions in state contracts.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 32-12.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 created and enacted as follows:

6 Indemnification and insurance requirements in state contracts.

- 71.The director of the office of management and budget shall establish guidelines for8indemnification and insurance provisions in contracts that may be entered by an9executive branch state agency. The director shall consult with representatives of10executive branch state agencies, the insurance industry, and the business11community to establish and revise the guidelines and provisions. The guidelines12must establish procedures for determining the appropriate indemnification and13insurance provisions in contracts.
- 14 <u>2.</u> If a contract for services requires a provision for indemnification, the contract must
 15 require the contractor to indemnify the state and its agencies, officers, and
- 16 employees for vicarious liability, but may not require indemnification for the
- 17 contributory negligence, comparative degree of fault, sole negligence, or
- 18 intentional misconduct of the state or its agencies, officers, and employees, unless
- 19 the director of the office of management and budget or the director's designee
- 20 determines a more stringent indemnification provision is appropriate. If
- 21 indemnification is required, the contract must require that the state be endorsed on
- 22 the contractor's commercial general liability policy as an additional insured or must
- 23 require an equivalent form of protection for the state.
