1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 5-03-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to allocation of wholesale taxes on wine for a state grape and wine program; to amend

3 and reenact section 5-03-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to allocation of beer

4 and liquor wholesale taxes; to provide a continuing appropriation; to provide an effective date;

5 and to provide an expiration date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 5-03-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

5-03-08. Taxes and fees deposited in the general fund allocation. All moneys
collected by the tax commissioner under this chapter must be transferred to the state treasurer,
within ten days after the end of the month in which they were collected, and deposited in the
state general fund except as provided in section 5-03-08.1.

13 SECTION 2. Section 5-03-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
14 enacted as follows:

15 <u>5-03-08.1. Taxes on wine allocated to grape and wine program - Continuing</u>

16 **appropriation.** The state treasurer shall deposit thirty percent of the tax collections from taxes

17 imposed on wine under section 5-03-07 in the grape and wine program fund. Moneys in the

18 grape and wine program fund are appropriated on a continuing basis to the agricultural

- 19 products utilization commission for allocation as follows:
- 20 <u>1.</u> <u>Seventy-five percent to the agricultural experiment station:</u>
- 21a.To provide research testing of the hardiness and performance of cold-climate22grape cultivars at field sites representative of North Dakota's various23environmental and soil conditions;

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1		<u>b.</u>	To enhance northern vineyard productivity by studying beneficial cultural and
2			crop management practices:
3		<u>C.</u>	To cooperate with other northern viticulture improvement programs in testing
4			and releasing hybrid materials;
5		<u>d.</u>	To support university instruction in viticulture and enology; and
6		<u>e.</u>	To provide research testing for other small fruit crops that may be useful for
7			wine processing.
8	<u>2.</u>	<u>Fift</u>	een percent to the North Dakota state university extension service to:
9		<u>a.</u>	Provide direct educational outreach to the state and regional grape growing
10			and the regional wine industry;
11		<u>b.</u>	Connect grape grower issues and concerns with university research
12			objectives;
13		<u>C.</u>	Promote and support university and public instruction in viticulture and
14			enology; and
15		<u>d.</u>	Offer assistance in education and training in viticulture cropping systems at
16			onsite research and grower field day events and related programs.
17	<u>3.</u>	Ter	percent to be expended upon recommendation of the North Dakota grape
18		gro	wers association for the promotion of North Dakota wines to:
19		<u>a.</u>	Provide promotional support for a state and regional grape and wine
20			marketing program;
21		<u>b.</u>	Encourage entrepreneurial skills of growers and winery owners;
22		<u>C.</u>	Promote and organize grower and wine industry events, including
23			conferences, workshops, field days, wine tastings, and similar events; and
24		<u>d.</u>	Represent the state and regional grape and wine industry.
25	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE - EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective for taxable		
26	events occurring after July 31, 2007, and before August 1, 2011, and is thereafter ineffective.
