1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 39-29-10 and 39-29-12 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to youth operation of off-highway vehicles; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-29-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **39-29-10.** Operation by persons under age sixteen. Except as otherwise provided in 7 this section, a person an individual under sixteen years of age who is not in possession of a 8 valid operator's license or permit to operate an all-terrain off-highway vehicle may not, except 9 upon the lands of the person's individual's parent or guardian, operate an all-terrain off-highway 10 vehicle. A person An individual at least twelve ten years of age may operate an all-terrain 11 off-highway vehicle if the person individual has completed an all-terrain off-highway vehicle 12 safety training course prescribed by the director of the parks and recreation department and 13 has received the appropriate all-terrain off-highway vehicle safety certificate issued by the 14 director of the department of transportation. An individual at least ten years of age and under 15 thirteen years of age may not operate an off-highway vehicle unless the vehicle is a class I or 16 class II off-highway vehicle with an engine of no more than ninety cubic centimeters and that 17 individual has received an off-highway vehicle safety certificate. An individual at least thirteen 18 years of age and under sixteen years of age may not operate an off-highway vehicle unless the 19 vehicle is a class I or class II off-highway vehicle and that individual has received an 20 off-highway vehicle safety certificate. An individual without a valid operator's license or permit 21 may not operate a class III off-highway vehicle. An individual under twelve years of age may 22 not operate an off-highway vehicle without the supervision of a legal guardian. The failure of an 23 operator to exhibit an all-terrain off-highway vehicle safety certificate on demand to any official 24 authorized to enforce this chapter is presumptive evidence that that person does not hold such

- 1 a certificate. Fees collected from each person individual receiving certification must be
- 2 deposited in the all-terrain off-highway vehicle trail tax fund for all-terrain off-highway vehicle
- 3 safety education and training programs.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-29-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **39-29-12. Penalties.** Violation of subdivision b, c, or g of subsection 5 of section

7 39-29-09 is a class B misdemeanor. Violation of any other provision of section 39-29-09 is an

8 infraction for which a fee of twenty dollars must be assessed. Violation of section 39-29-02 is

- 9 an infraction, for which a fee of fifty dollars must be assessed. If the individual provides proof of
- 10 registration since the violation, the fee may be reduced by one-half. Violation of any other
- 11 provision of this chapter is an infraction, for which a fee of ten twenty dollars must be assessed.
