- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to electronic course delivery; to provide for a legislative council report;
- 3 and to provide an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 created and enacted as follows:

Electronic course delivery - Approval process.

- Before a person may provide elementary or high school courses electronically to a
 student, school, or school district in this state, the person must obtain annual
 approval from the superintendent of public instruction. The electronic delivery of a
 course includes online and technological delivery methods.
 Before the superintendent of public instruction may grant approval to a person
 under this section, the superintendent shall verify that:
- All courses offered by the person in this state are aligned with the state
 content and performance standards and if standards do not exist for a
- particular course, the criteria must ensure that the course content is
 sufficiently challenging for students, given the grade level at which it is
 offered;
- 19b.All teachers involved in the electronic delivery of a course meet or exceed the20qualifications and licensure requirements placed on the teachers by the state21in which the course originates; and

 All students receiving a course electronically have ongoing contact time with

 the teachers of the course.

- 1 SECTION 2. REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. During the 2007-08 interim, the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction shall provide a report to the legislative council regarding the
- 3 planning and development of the electronic course delivery approval process to be
- 4 implemented as provided in this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 1 of this Act becomes effective on July 1,
- 6 2009.
