- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 12-47 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to health care for chronically or terminally ill offenders.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 12-47 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 created and enacted as follows:

## Definitions - Health care for chronically or terminally ill offenders - Notice to health care facility.

- 8 <u>1.</u> <u>As used in this section:</u>
- 9 <u>a.</u> <u>"Chronically ill" has the same meaning as in section 26.1-33.2-01.</u>
- 10 b. <u>"Department" means the department of corrections and rehabilitation.</u>
- 11c."Health care facility" means an assisted living facility as defined in section1223-09-01, a basic care facility as defined in section 23-09.3-01, or a nursing13home as defined in section 23-30-01, except that transitional care units and14other long-term care beds owned or operated on the premises of acute care15hospitals or critical care hospitals are not health care facilities for the purpose16of this section.
- 17 <u>d.</u> <u>"Terminally ill" has the same meaning as in section 26.1-33.2-01.</u>
- <u>If an offender is to be given an early release, pardon, or parole due to a chronic or</u>
  <u>terminal illness for admission as a resident of a health care facility due to the</u>
  <u>chronic or terminal illness, at least fifteen days before the offender's admission as</u>
  a resident of a health care facility the department shall provide written notice to the
- 22 <u>administrator of the facility, stating:</u>
- 23a.The offense for which the offender was convicted and a description of the24actual offense;

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1		<u>b.</u>	The offender's status with the department;
2		<u>C.</u>	That, subject to subsection 3, the information provided by the department
3			regarding the offender may be provided to residents and employees of the
4			facility by the administrator of the facility;
5		<u>d.</u>	The offender's health status and type of health care the offender requires;
6		<u>e.</u>	Any available risk assessment information regarding the offender's likelihood
7			of reoffending; and
8		<u>f.</u>	The name of the party responsible for the payment for the services provided
9			by the health care facility to the offender.
10	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	e administrator of the facility may provide notice to each resident of the facility or
11		<u>the</u>	resident's guardians and the employees of the facility that a convicted felon is
12		<u>beiı</u>	ng admitted to the facility.
