- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 19-18-04 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to pesticide registration fees; and to provide an appropriation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 19-18-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **19-18-04. (Effective through June 30, 2007) Registration - Fees.**

- Any person before selling or offering for sale any pesticide for use within this state
 shall file biennially with the commissioner an application for registration of the
 pesticide. The application must:
- 10 a. Give the name and address of each manufacturer or distributor.

b. Give the name and brand of each product to be registered.

- 12 c. Be accompanied by a current label of each product to be registered.
- 13d.Be accompanied by a registration fee of three hundred fifty dollars for each14product to be registered. At the close of each calendar month, the15commissioner shall transmit to the state treasurer all moneys received for the16registrations. The state treasurer shall credit fifty dollars for each registered17product to the general fund in the state treasury and the remainder of the18registration fee for each registered product to the environment and rangeland19protection fund.
- 20 e. Be accompanied by a material safety data sheet for each product to be21 registered.
- The commissioner may require an applicant or registrant to provide efficacy,
 toxicity, residue, and any other data necessary to determine if the pesticide will
 perform its intended function without unreasonable adverse effects on the

16	<u>5.</u>	At the close of each calendar month, the commissioner shall transmit to the state			
17		treasurer all registration fees received. The state treasurer shall credit the			
18		registration fees to the environment and rangeland protection fund.			
19	<u>6.</u>	This section does not apply to a pesticide sold by a retail dealer if the registration			
20		fee has been paid by the manufacturer, jobber, or any other person, as required by			
21		this section.			
22	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the				
23	environment and rangeland protection fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated,				
24	the sum of \$325,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the agriculture				
25	commissioner for the purpose of establishing an endangered species program, for the biennium				
26	beginning J	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
