- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-10-17.4 and 15.1-35-08 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the preparation and provision of meals by institutions of higher
- 3 education and school districts.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-17.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15-10-17.4. Contract - Preparation and provision of meals - Policy. An institution under the control of the state board of higher education may enter a contract to prepare and provide meals, snacks, or other food services for persons or programs not provide catering services for an event that is not held on property owned by the institution, only if the event is organized predominantly for persons affiliated with the institution, provided the institution first establishes a policy regarding such contracts and specifically addressing issues related to competition with private sector entities. An institution under the control of the state board of higher education may not advertise to the general public its willingness to provide meals, snacks, or other food services for persons or programs not affiliated with the event is held predominantly for persons enrolled in the institution, or the event is held under the auspices of the institution.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-35-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-35-08. Contract - Preparation and provision of meals.

The board of a school district <u>headquartered in a city having more than five</u>
<u>thousand residents</u> may <u>enter into a contract to not prepare and or provide meals,</u>
snacks, or other food services for persons or programs not affiliated with the school
district, <u>provided any person that wishes to enter a contract with the board under</u>

2		private entities able and willing to enter into such a contract.
3	2.	The board of a school district may not advertise to the general public its willingness
4		to provide meals, snacks, or other food services for persons or programs not
5		affiliated with the district.
6	3.	An institution under the control of the state board of higher education may not
7		advertise to the general public its willingness to provide meals, snacks, or other
8		food services for persons or programs not affiliated with the institution.
