## ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2371

A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-23-01, 15.1-23-02, 15.1-23-03, 1

2 15.1-23-04, 15.1-23-05, 15.1-23-06, 15.1-23-07, 15.1-23-09, 15.1-23-10, 15.1-23-11,

3 15.1-23-12, 15.1-23-13, 15.1-23-14, 15.1-23-15, 15.1-23-16, 15.1-23-17, and 15.1-23-18 of the

4 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the provision of home education.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 15.1-23-01. Home education - Definition. For purposes of this chapter, "home

9 education" means a program of education offered in accordance with this chapter and

10 supervised by a child's parent:

11 Parent, in the child's home, in accordance with the requirements of this chapter; or 1. 12 2. Grandparent, in the grandparent's home.

13 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 14 amended and reenacted as follows:

15 15.1-23-02. Statement of intent to supervise home education. At least fourteen 16 days before beginning home education or within fourteen days of establishing a child's 17 residence in a school district, and once each year thereafter, a parent the individual intending to supervise or supervising home education shall file a statement, reflecting that intent or fact, 18

19 with the superintendent of the child's school district of residence or if no superintendent is

20 employed, with the county superintendent of schools for the child's county of residence.

- 22
- The name and address of the child receiving home education; a.
- 23 b. The child's date of birth;
- 24 The child's grade level; C.

1		d.	The name and address of the parent individual who will supervise the home

5		f.	Any public school courses in which the child intends to participate and the
6			school district offering the courses; and
7		g.	Any extracurricular activities in which the child intends to participate and the
8			school district or approved nonpublic school offering the activities.

results. If the child transfers to a public school district, the parent individual supervising home
 <u>education</u> shall furnish the record, upon request, to the school district superintendent or other
 administrator.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

6 15.1-23-06. Home education - Required monitoring of progress. A parent An 7 individual who has a high school diploma or a general education development certificate may 8 supervise home education but must be monitored in accordance with section 15.1-23-07 for the 9 first two years. If a child receiving home education obtains either a below grade level 10 proficiency score in any subject tested on the state achievement assessment or a basic 11 composite standardized achievement test score below the fiftieth percentile nationally, in any 12 subject tested on an alternative assessment specified in section 15.1-23-09, the parent 13 individual must be monitored for at least one additional school year and until the child receives 14 a test score at or above the fiftieth percentile on an alternative assessment specified in section 15 15.1-23-09. If testing is not required by section 15.1-23-07 during the first two years of 16 monitoring, the period of monitoring may not be extended, except upon the mutual consent of 17 the parent individual and the monitor. If a parent an individual completes the monitoring 18 requirements of this section for one child, the parent individual may not be monitored with 19 respect to other children for whom the parent individual supervises home education. 20 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-23-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows: 22 15.1-23-07. Home education - Required monitoring of progress - Reporting of

If monitoring is required under section 15.1-23-06, the school district shall assign
 and compensate an individual to <u>a</u> monitor a child receiving home education
 unless the parent individual supervising the child's home education notifies the
 school district that the parent individual shall select and compensate an individual
 to <u>a</u> monitor <u>for</u> the child.

29 2. The individual monitor assigned by the school district or selected by the parent
 30 individual supervising the child's home education under subsection 1 must be

1		licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board or approved to	
2		teach by the education standards and practices board.	
3	3.	Twice during each school year, the individual monitor shall report the child's	
4		progress to the school district superintendent or to the county superintendent if the	
5		district does not employ a superintendent.	
6	4.	If one child receives home education, the individual monitor shall spend an	
7		average of one hour per week in contact with the child and the child's parent	
8		individual supervising the child's home education. If two or more children receive	
9		home education, the individual monitor shall spend one-half hour per month for	
10		each additional child receiving home education. If the child attends a public or an	
11		approved nonpublic school, the time may be proportionately reduced.

16			the school district if, at the request of the child's parent individual supervising

19			individual who is employed by the district and who is licensed to teach by the		
20			education standards and practices board or approved to teach by the		
21			education standards and practices board.

If the multidisciplinary assessment team determines that the child is not disabled 6 and the individual supervising the child's parent home education wishes to 7 continue home education, the parent individual, with the advice and consent of an 8 individual one who is licensed to teach by the education standards and practices 9 board or approved to teach by the education standards and practices board, shall 10 prepare a remediation plan to address the child's academic deficiencies and file 11 the plan with the superintendent of the school district or with the county 12 superintendent if the district does not employ a superintendent. The parent 13 individual supervising the child's home education is responsible for any costs 14 associated with the development of the remediation plan. If the parent individual 15 supervising the child's home education fails to file a remediation plan, the parent 16 individual is deemed to be in violation of compulsory school attendance provisions
- 17 and may no longer supervise the home education of the child.

SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

20 **15.1-23-12.** Home education - Remediation plan. The superintendent of the school 21 district shall use the remediation plan required by section 15.1-23-11 as the basis for 22 determining reasonable academic progress. The remediation plan must remain in effect until 23 such time as the child achieves on a standardized achievement test a basic composite a score 24 above the lowest achievement level on every subject tested on the state achievement 25 assessment or at or above the thirtieth percentile on every subject tested on an alternative 26 assessment specified in section 15.1-23-09, or a score, which when compared to the previous 27 year's test score, demonstrates one year of academic progress. At the option of the parent 28 individual supervising the child's home education, the test may be one required by section 29 15.1-23-09 or one administered in a higher grade level. The individual supervising the child's 30 parent home education, with the advice and consent of an individual one who is licensed to 31 teach by the education standards and practices board or who is approved to teach by the

1	education standards and practices board, may amend the remediation plan from time to time in			
2	order to accommodate the child's academic needs. If after a remediation plan is no longer in			
3	effect the child fails to demonstrate reasonable academic progress on a subsequent test			
4	required by	this s	sectior	n, a remediation plan must again be developed and implemented.

5	15. <sup>-</sup>	I-23-14. Child with a developmental disability - Home education. A parent An		
6	individual may supervise home education for a child with a developmental disability if:			
7	1.	The child has been determined to have a developmental disability by a licensed		
8		psychologist;		
9	2.	The child's parent individual supervising the child's home education is qualified to		
10		supervise home education under this chapter; and		
11	3.	The child's parent individual files with the superintendent of the child's school		
12		district of residence:		
13		a. A notice that the child will receive home education;		
14		b. A copy of the child's diagnosis of a developmental disability prepared and		
15		attested to by a licensed psychologist; and		
16		c. A services plan developed and followed by the child's school district of		
17		residence and the child's parent individual; or, after providing written notice to		
18		the superintendent of the child's school district of residence, a substitute		
19		services plan, developed and followed, according to section 15.1-23-15, by a		
20		services plan team selected by and compensated by the child's parent		
21		individual supervising the child's home education.

29		school district of residence progress reports prepared by the services plan team		
30		selected under section 15.1-23-14. If at any time the services plan team agrees		
31		that the child is not benefiting from home education, the team shall notify the		

1		superintendent of the child's school district of residence and request that the child			
2		be evaluated by a multidisciplinary team appointed by the superintendent of the			
3		child's school district of residence.			
4	2.	The superintendent of the child's school district of residence shall forward copies of			
5		all documentation required by this section to the superintendent of public			
6		instruction.			
7	SEC	CTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
8	amended a	ed and reenacted as follows:			
9	15.1	I-23-16. Home education - Participation in extracurricular activities.			
10	1.	A child receiving home education may participate in extracurricular activities either:			
11		a. Under the auspices of the child's school district of residence; or			
12		b. Under the auspices of an approved nonpublic school, if permitted by the			
13		administrator of the school.			
14	2.	For purposes of this section, a child participating under the auspices of the child's			
15		school district of residence is subject to the same standards for participation in			
16		extracurricular activities as those required of full-time students enrolled in the			
17		district.			
18	3.	For purposes of this section, a child participating under the auspices of an			
19		approved nonpublic school is subject to the same standards for participation in			
20		extracurricular activities as those required of full-time students enrolled in the			
21		school.			
22	4.	Once a child's parent an individual supervising the child's home education has			
23		selected the public school district or the approved nonpublic school in which the			
24		child will participate for purposes of extracurricular activities and has provided			
25		notification of the selection through the statement required by section 15.1-23-02,			
26		the child is subject to the transfer rules as provided in the constitution and bylaws			
27		of the North Dakota high school activities association.			
28	SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
29	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:			
30	15.1	I-23-17. Home education - High school diplomas.			

1 A child's school district of residence, an approved nonpublic high school, or the 1. 2 North Dakota division of independent study may issue a high school diploma to a 3 child who, through home education, has met the issuing entity's requirements for 4 high school graduation provided the child's parent individual supervising the child's 5 home education submits to the issuing entity a description of the course material 6 covered in each high school subject, a description of the course objectives and 7 how the objectives were met, and a transcript of the child's performance in grades 8 nine through twelve.

9 2. In the alternative, a high school diploma may be issued by the child's school district 10 of residence, an approved nonpublic high school, or the North Dakota division of 11 independent study provided the child, through home education, has completed at 12 least twenty-one units of high school coursework from the minimum required 13 curriculum offerings established by law for public and nonpublic schools and the 14 child's parent or legal guardian individual supervising the child's home education submits to the issuing entity a description of the course material covered in each 15 16 high school subject, a description of the course objectives and how the objectives 17 were met, and a transcript of the child's performance in grades nine through 18 twelve. The issuing entity may indicate on a diploma issued under this subsection 19 that the child was provided with home education.

If for any reason the documentation required in subsection 1 or 2 is unavailable,
 the entity issuing the diploma may accept any other reasonable proof that the child
 has met the applicable requirements for high school graduation.

23 SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-23-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-23-18. Home education - Liability. No state agency, school district, or county
superintendent may be held liable for accepting as correct the information on the statement of
intent or for any damages resulting from a parent's the failure of any individual supervising the
child's home education to educate the child.
