HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3051

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the procedures through which 2 members of the Legislative Assembly are elected. 3 WHEREAS, before the amendment of the Constitution of North Dakota in 1996, the 4 term of office of members of the House of Representatives was two years, and therefore, an 5 election for members of the Legislative Assembly was held in each legislative district during 6 each general election; and 7 WHEREAS, beginning with the 1998 general election, senators and representatives 8 have been elected for four-year terms, staggered so that all members of the Legislative 9 Assembly from each legislative district are elected at the same general election; and 10 WHEREAS, as a result of the current method of staggering terms, elections for 11 legislative offices are held only once every four years in each legislative district; and 12 WHEREAS, the lack of legislative elections in approximately one-half of the legislative 13 districts in nonpresidential election years may be a factor contributing to a significant decline in 14 voter turnout for elections in North Dakota during nonpresidential election years; 15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 16 OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 17 That the Legislative Council study the procedures through which members of the 18 Legislative Assembly are elected; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and 20 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to 21 the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly.
