1	A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study issues relating to child
2	custody, visitation, and child support in this state, including issues of fairness and equity as they
3	relate to the issuance and enforcement of child custody, visitation, and child support orders and
4	whether the state should pursue nonadversarial alternatives for the resolution of family law
5	disputes.
6	WHEREAS, the issues involved in family relationships, including custody, visitation,
7	support of children, and the rights and responsibilities of parents to their children, result in a
8	complex family law system; and
9	WHEREAS, approximately 70 percent of the caseload of North Dakota courts involves
10	issues related to family law, including divorce, custody, visitation, and child support, as well as
11	modifications to custody, visitation, and child support orders; and
12	WHEREAS, child visitation and custody arrangements are often established through an
13	adversarial process that may detrimentally affect the possibility of a continuing relationship
14	between a child and both parents; and
15	WHEREAS, traditional custody and visitation enforcement actions promote an
16	adversarial climate between the parties involved and are not always effective in resolving
17	custody and visitation disputes; and
18	WHEREAS, every child has a right to be guided, nurtured, and supported emotionally,
19	physically, and financially by both parents regardless of the parents' marital status; and
20	WHEREAS, North Dakota law provides that for the purposes of determining custody,
21	there is no presumption as to which parent will better promote the best interests of the child;
22	and
23	WHEREAS, concerns have been expressed that there are inequities in the enforcement
24	of child custody and visitation orders and in the child support guidelines as they relate to
