SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4024

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study universal health care for North 2 Dakotans, including consideration of how other states have addressed access to health care, 3 the costs and benefits associated with universal health care, and the impact of universal health 4 care on children, adults, and families. 5 WHEREAS, individuals who are medically uninsured or underinsured face a number of 6 obstacles to their financial and medical well-being, including higher out-of-pocket costs for care, 7 poorer health outcomes than their fully insured counterparts, and a greater likelihood that easily 8 treatable ailments will go untreated and become serious medical problems; and 9 WHEREAS, although most North Dakotans have some type of health insurance through 10 employer coverage, individual coverage, Medicaid, or Medicare, more than 71,400 North 11 Dakotans lack health insurance of any type; and 12 WHEREAS, costs of health care for the uninsured are shifted to hospitals through 13 increased emergency visits and uncompensated care and are shifted to insured North 14 Dakotans through increased premiums to cover medical costs of those lacking coverage for 15 cost-effective, preventive care; and 16 WHEREAS, even individuals with private health insurance coverage can be at risk of 17 having high out-of-pocket health care costs and understanding the degree to which rural and 18 urban residents of this state are underinsured has important implications for health policy and 19 practice; and 20 WHEREAS, other states have risen to meet the challenge of ensuring their residents 21 have health care coverage, including Illinois, Maine, Massachusetts, and Vermont; and 22 WHEREAS, states have always been policy innovators and laboratories of reform and

North Dakota can lead in taking efforts to increase access to, control costs of, and improve the

quality of health care provided to North Dakotans;

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Legislative Council study universal health care for North Dakotans, including consideration of how other states have addressed universal health care, the costs and benefits associated with universal health care, and the impact of universal health care on children, adults, and families; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly.
