1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the financial and

2 environmental impact of confined animal feeding operations on individual property owners and

3 local communities and develop clear, concise, and consistent laws governing the siting and

- 4 regulation of confined animal feeding operations.
- 5 **WHEREAS**, confined animal feeding operations in this sate account for approximately
- 6 25 percent of all agricultural income; and

7 WHEREAS, byproducts from the expansion of ethanol and biodiesel industries will

8 provide opportunities for increases in confined animal feeding operations; and

9 WHEREAS, the siting of confined animal feeding operations is currently governed by

10 various state agencies, boards of county commissioners, and boards of township supervisors;

11 and

WHEREAS, conflicts and inconsistencies exist between the laws and regulations of the
various governmental entities; and

WHEREAS, the growth and development of confined animal feeding operations need to
be balanced against the financial and environmental impacts that such operations can have on
individual landowners and local communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
 OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

19 That the Legislative Council study the financial and environmental impact of confined 20 animal feeding operations on individual property owners and local communities and develop 21 clear, concise, and consistent laws governing the siting and regulation of confined animal 22 feeding operations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and
 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
 the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly.
