## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1014

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state industrial
- 2 commission and the agencies under the management of the industrial commission; to authorize
- 3 transfers; to provide an exemption; to create and enact a new section to chapter 6-09.17 of the
- 4 North Dakota Century Code, relating to partnership in assisting community expansion fund
- 5 incentive limitations; to amend and reenact subsection 6 of section 6-09-15 and section
- 6 6-09.17-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers of the Bank of North
- 7 Dakota and the biodiesel partnership in assisting community expansion fund; to provide a
- 8 contingent appropriation; and to declare an emergency.

## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10 **SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.** The amounts identified in this

section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the state industrial

8	SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The total general fund a	appropriation line item in
9	section 3 of this Act includes \$4,680,000 for the one-time funding items identified in this	
10	section. This amount is not a part of the agency's base budget to be used in preparing the	
11	2009-11 executive budget. The industrial commission shall report to the appropriations	
12	committees of the sixty-first legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the	
13	biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

18	SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION. In addition to the amount a	appropriated to the housing
19	finance agency in subdivision 5 of section 3 of this Act, there is appropriated any additional	
20	income or unanticipated income from federal or other funds which may become available to the	
21	agency for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.	
22	SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - EMERGENCY COMMISSION APPROVAL. In	
23	addition to the amount appropriated to the state industrial commission	on in subdivision 1 of
24	section 3 of this Act, there is appropriated, with the approval of the e	emergency commission,
25	funds that may become available to the commission from bonds autl	horized by law to be issued
26	by the state industrial commission under chapters 4-36 and 54-17.2	and section 54-17-25, for
27	the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.	
28	SECTION 7. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated to the	Bank of North Dakota in
29	the capital assets line item in sections 3 and 6 of 2005 Senate Bill N	o. 2014 is not subject to the
30	provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this a	appropriation are available

- 1 for construction of a new building during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending 2 June 30, 2009.
- SECTION 8. TRANSFER. The sum of \$80,195, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the North Dakota mill and elevator association. The moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.
  - **SECTION 9. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$102,066, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the accumulated and undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota. The moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.
  - **SECTION 10. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$69,259, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the housing finance agency fund. The moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.
  - **SECTION 11. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$21,872, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the revenues of the public finance authority. The available moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.
  - **SECTION 12. INCOME AUTHORIZATION STUDENT LOAN TRUST.** There is authorized the receipt of fees by the state industrial commission in the sum of \$91,131, or so much of the sum as is owed, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, from the student loan trust for administrative services rendered by the state industrial commission to the extent permitted by sections 54-17-24 and 54-17-25. The fees must be received during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.
  - SECTION 13. LIGNITE RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, AND MARKETING

    PROGRAM APPROPRIATION LIGNITE MARKETING FEASIBILITY STUDY. The amount

1	of \$1,500,000, or so much of the amount as may be necessary, inclu	ded in the grants and
2	special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of the	nis Act, is appropriated
3	from the lignite research fund for the purpose of contracting for an independent, nonmatching	
4	lignite marketing feasibility study or studies that determine those focused priority areas where	
5	near-term, market-driven projects, activities, or processes will general	te matching private
6	industry investment and have the most potential of preserving existing	g lignite production and
7	industry jobs or that will lead to increased development of lignite and	its products and create
8	new lignite industry jobs and economic growth for the general welfare	e of this state. Moneys
9	appropriated pursuant to this section may also be used for the purpose of contracting for	
10	nonmatching studies and activities in support of the lignite vision 21 project; for nonmatching	
11	externality studies and activities in externality proceedings; or other marketing, environmental,	
12	or transmission activities that assist with marketing of lignite-based electricity and lignite-based	
13	byproducts. Moneys not needed for the purposes stated in this section are available to the	
14	commission for funding projects, processes, or activities under the lignite research,	
15	development, and marketing program.	
16	SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BOND PAYMENTS.	The amount of
17	\$29,475,016 included in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act in the g	rants - bond payments line
18	item must be paid from the following funding sources during the bien	nium beginning July 1,

7	SECTION 15. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER. The funds app	ropriated in
8	subdivision 3 of section 3 of this Act must be transferred by the Bank of North Dakota to the	
9	partnership in assisting community expansion fund; the agriculture partnership in assisting	
10	community expansion fund; and the biofuels partnership in assisting com	nmunity expansion
11	fund. The Bank of North Dakota may not be construed to be a general fund agency because of	
12	the appropriation made by subdivision 3 of section 3 of this Act.	
13	SECTION 16. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. Notwithstanding any other provision of law,	
14	the Bank of North Dakota may transfer any unobligated funds between for	unds that have been
15	appropriated by the legislative assembly for partnership in assisting community expansion fund	
16	and the biofuels partnership in assisting community expansion fund.	
17	SECTION 17. TRANSFER - BUDGET SECTION APPROVAL.	Notwithstanding any
18	other provision of law, the Bank of North Dakota may transfer any unobligated funds that have	
19	been appropriated by the legislative assembly for the medical partnership in assisting	
20	community expansion fund to the partnership in assisting community expansion fund, upon	
21	approval by the budget section.	
22	SECTION 18. AMENDMENT. Subsection 6 of section 6-09-15 of	of the North Dakota
23	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
24	6. Lease, assign, sell, exchange, transfer, convey, grant, plede	ge, or mortgage all real
25	and personal property, title to which has been acquired in a	ny manner.
26	SECTION 19. AMENDMENT. Section 6-09.17-02 of the North [	Dakota Century Code is
27	amended and reenacted as follows:	
28	6-09.17-02. Biodiesel partnership in assisting community ex	pansion fund -
29	Continuing appropriation - Administration. A biodiesel partnership in	assisting community

expansion fund is hereby established. All moneys transferred into the fund, interest on fund

moneys, and payments to the fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes of this chapter.

- 1 This fund is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended and unobligated balance in
- 2 the fund at the end of the biennium must be transferred to the state general fund biofuels
- 3 partnership in assisting community expansion fund. The Bank of North Dakota shall administer
- 4 the fund.

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- **SECTION 20.** A new section to chapter 6-09.17 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 Partnership in assisting community expansion fund incentive limitation. A
- 8 <u>biodiesel production facility or ethanol production facility that receives interest buydown from</u>
- 9 the biofuels partnership in assisting community expansion fund is not eligible to receive interest
- 10 <u>buydown from the partnership in assisting community expansion fund for the same project</u>
- 11 during the same biennium.
- 12 SECTION 21. CONTINGENT OIL AND GAS DIVISION FUNDING EMERGENCY
- 13 **COMMISSION APPROVAL.** The funds appropriated in the oil and gas division contingency
- 14 line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act are from the land and minerals trust fund. If
- 15 funds are required due to the average drilling rig count exceeding forty-five active rigs for each
- 16 month in any consecutive three-month period, the oil and gas division may spend moneys from
- 17 this line item upon emergency commission approval. The oil and gas division may hire up to
- 18 two full-time equivalent positions with the contingency funds.
- 19 **SECTION 22. EMERGENCY.** The appropriation in subdivision 3 of section 3 of this
- 20 Act for the partnership in assisting community expansion fund; the transfer in section 15 of this
- 21 Act for the partnership in assisting community expansion fund; and the transfer in section 16 of
- 22 this Act between the partnership in assisting community expansion fund and the biofuels
- 23 partnership in assisting community expansion fund are declared to be emergency measures.
