- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-12.1-08, 43-12.1-09, and 43-12.1-10 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the issuance of limited licenses and registrations by the
- 3 board of nursing and the requirements of nurse applicants for license by endorsement.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-12.1-08. Duties of the board.

- 1. The board shall regulate the practice of nursing. Regulation of the practice of nursing must ensure that a person may not practice or offer to practice nursing or use titles of advanced practice registered nurse, specialty practice registered nurse, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, or unlicensed assistive person, or titles of a similar nature which denote the practice of nursing to the general public unless licensed or registered as provided in this chapter.
- 2. The board shall:
 - a. Enforce this chapter.
 - Adopt rules necessary to administer this chapter after collaborating and consulting with North Dakota nursing associations and other affected parties.
 - c. Appoint and employ a registered nurse to serve as executive director and approve any additional staff positions necessary to administer this chapter.
 - d. Establish fees and receive all moneys collected under this chapter and authorize all expenditures necessary to conduct the business of the board. Any balance of fees after payment of expenditures must be used to administer this chapter.

12		k.	Conduct and support projects pertaining to nursing education and practice.
13		I.	Notify the board of pharmacy on an annual basis, or more frequent basis if
14			necessary, of advanced practice registered nurses authorized to write
15			prescriptions.
16		m.	Adopt rules to allow nurses licensed by another state to receive short-term
17			clinical education in North Dakota health care facilities.

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1 (2) Submit an official transcript showing completion of an in-state nursing 2 education program or a board-approved out-of-state nursing education 3 program preparing for the level of licensure sought. The board shall 4 adopt rules establishing standards for the approval of out-of-state 5 nursing education programs. These standards for out-of-state 6 programs must include consideration of whether the program is 7 accredited by the national league for nursing accrediting commission, 8 incorporated, or the commission on collegiate nursing education and 9 whether the program meets the requirements of the state in which the 10 program is provided. 11 (3)Pass an examination approved by the board. 12 b. An applicant for licensure by endorsement to practice as a registered nurse or 13 licensed practical nurse shall: 14 Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by (1) the board. 15 16 (2) Submit an official transcript showing completion of a nursing education 17 program preparing for the level of licensure sought. 18 (3) Submit proof of initial licensure by examination with the examination 19 meeting North Dakota requirements for licensure examinations in effect 20 at the time the applicant qualified for initial licensure. 21 (4) Submit evidence of current unencumbered licensure in another state or 22 meet continued competency requirements as established by the board. 23 (5)Notwithstanding the foregoing requirements of this subdivision, if an 24 applicant for licensure as a licensed practical nurse has been licensed 25 in another state as a licensed practical nurse based upon completion of 26 a registered nurse education program and has had at least twenty-four 27 months of unencumbered practice as a licensed practical nurse in that 28 state within the five-year period preceding the application, then the 29 applicant is not required to meet any additional educational 30 requirements for licensure as a licensed practical nurse.

An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse shall:

1 (1) Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by 2 the board. 3 (2) Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in an 4 advanced nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting 5 criteria as established by the board. An advanced practice registered 6 nurse applicant must have a graduate degree with a nursing focus or 7 must have completed the educational requirements in effect when the 8 applicant was initially licensed. 9 (3)Possess or show evidence of application for a current unencumbered 10 registered nurse license. 11 d. An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse who 12 completed an advanced nursing education program and was licensed or 13 certified in advanced practice by another state before January 1, 2001, or who 14 completed an advanced nursing education program and was licensed or 15 certified as a women's health care nurse practitioner by another state before 16 January 1, 2007, may apply for and receive an advanced practice license if 17 that applicant meets the requirements that were in place in this state at the 18 time the applicant qualified for initial advanced practice licensure in that state. 19 An applicant for unlicensed assistive person registration shall: e. 20 (1) Submit a completed application and the appropriate fee as established 21 by the board. 22 (2) Provide verification of appropriate training or evidence of certification or 23 evaluation in the performance of basic nursing interventions. 24 f. An applicant for licensure as a specialty practice registered nurse shall: 25 (1) Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by 26 the board. 27 (2) Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in a 28 specialty nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting criteria 29 as established by the board. A specialty practice registered nurse 30 applicant must have the educational preparation and national 31 certification within a defined area of nursing practice.

AMENDMENT.** Section 43-12.1-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 6 7 43-12.1-10. Renewal of license or registration - Reactivation. 8 The board shall renew a current license to practice as an advanced practice 9 registered nurse, specialty practice registered nurse, registered nurse, or licensed 10 practical nurse if the licensee submits a renewal application, submits the 11 appropriate fee established by the board, and meets all requirements for licensure. 12 If a licensee does not renew a license before the license expires, the board shall 13 reactivate that license if that licensee meets the reactivation requirements set by 14 the board. The board shall renew the registration of an unlicensed assistive person if the 15 2. 16 registrant submits a renewal application, the appropriate fee established by the 17 board, and documentation of competency by the employer or evidence of 18 certification or evaluation. A lapsed unlicensed assistive person registration may
 - be reactivated upon submission of the application, payment of the appropriate fee established by the board, and documentation of competency or evidence of certification or evaluation.

 3. For good cause shown, the board may issue a limited license or registration to a licensee or registrant. The board shall adopt rules establishing qualifications for
 - issuing limited licenses and registrations pursuant to this subsection.
